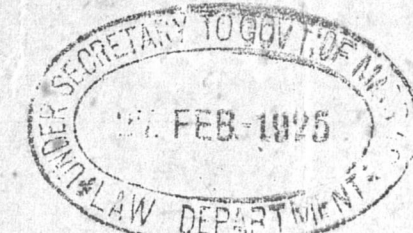

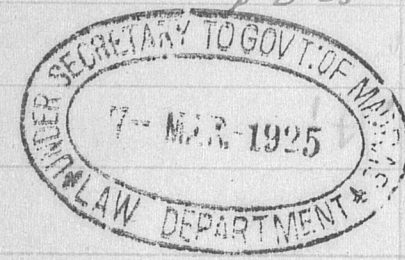

found in all the admission forms. It has been
found, however, in certain cases that the managers
of schools regard their signature of the statement
as a mere formality not binding upon them. My
experience as Principal of the Teachers' College,
Saidapet, in recent years has been that in a
number of cases managers have repudiated the
obligation

obligation to employ teachers after training although they have signed the statement, and even when addressed on the subject they have not provided the teachers with employment. The mere signing of the statement has no legal force but does create a moral obligation and Mr. Littlehailes was of opinion that the Principal of the Teachers' College should not admit students for training whose applications had been endorsed by school managements which had broken faith in the matter of re-employing teachers after their training without specific orders from the D.P.I.

This being the general position, it may be noted that the question relates specifically to managers who have recommended teachers for training, that is to say, managers who have signed the statement quoted at the beginning of this note. A suitable answer is difficult to suggest. Perhaps it would do to say "there is a moral but not a legal obligation".

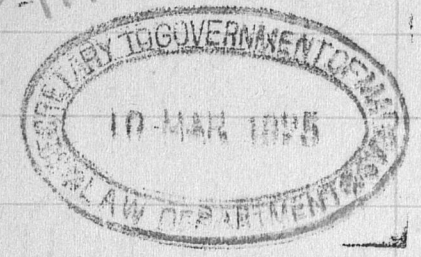
