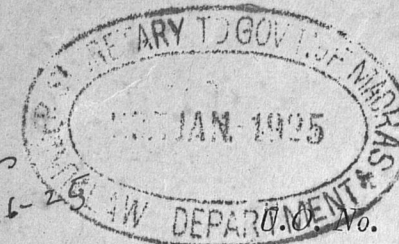

Education tax is being levied in twenty-two out of twenty five districts in the Presidency.
