Subd that there are no orders to the effect that preference should be given to members of the depressed classes. G. O. No. 658 Subd 15.8.1922 (S) lays down the broad principle that endeavours should always be made to divide the principal appointments in each district among the several Castes. There is no reason to suppose that this principle is violated ^(by the appointing authority) in the case of the depressed classes. In this connection reference is solicited to the answer to a question regarding the appointment of jains in Govt. service. (K)

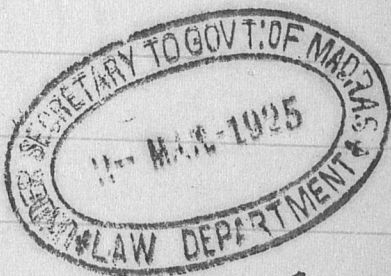
