2. Miss Gordon's work as Kindergarten Lecturer, Teachers' College, Saidapet has been good. I shall be pleased to give any further information regarding Miss Gordon that the Burma authorities may desire.

the Secretary to the Government of Burma, Department of Education,
Rangoon, dated the 8th April 1925.-

In reply for one of the posts of Inspectress of Schools in the Indian Educational Service of the Government of Burma, advertised in the Madras Mail of April 7th, I have the honour to state that I am a Bachelor of Education of the University of Edinburgh, and also hold the Diploma of the Froebel International Association of London.

2. I came out to India in March 1916 as Lecturer in Child Study and Early Education, and Superintendent of the Kindergarten and Primary School Department attached to the Teachers' College, Saidapet.

3. In May 1918 I was sent by the Madras Government on Special Duty to Ceylon, to visit the schools for the sons and daughters of Kandian Chiefs, and report on the same. In May 1919 I was sent on special duty to Eastern Bengal to inspect the elementary schools and training institutions of that Province and report on the same. In March 1920, I was invited by the Committee of the Child Welfare Association of All India, to represent Madras, and to give a lecture on the Elementary School Work and Early Education done in this Province, at the Exhibition organised by H.E. Lady Chelmsford. And my lecture was reported in full in the Government of India Report of the Exhibition. I was, at the same time, deputed by the Madras Government to inspect the schools in the Provinces of Delhi and Agra and report on the same.

4. In 1922, I was requested by the Director of Public Instruction, Madras, on the instance of the Commissioner for Education with the Government of India to carry on a series of experiments in Mental Intelligence Tests. My report on these experiments has been published as a Bulletin of the Department by the Madras Government on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Education with the Government of India.

5. I have published several books on Child-study and Education, all of which are used as Text-books in this Province as well as in Bengal and the United Provinces. One of my books has been recommended by the Academic Council of the Madras University as a Text book for students taking the University Degree in Education. And another was translated by the orders of the Director of Public Instruction into all the vernaculars of this Province.

6. I have been an Examiner in the Government and University Examinations in Teaching in this Province, and am a Member of the Text-book Committee appointed by the Government of Madras.

7. I am the Secretary of the Gazetted Women Officers' Association of this Province; and I have been requested to deliver a lecture on the Improvement of Elementary Education at a Conference to be held by the United Missionary Societies of India, at Kodaikanal next month.

8. I am a Member of the Board of Teaching of the Madras University and was placed on a Special Committee for revising the University Syllabus in child-study for the L.T.Degree examination. I have also been placed on a Special Committee for revising the Government Elementary Training School Syllabus.

9. Before my coming out to India I was a teacher in the Michaelis Girls School, London, which is one of the Demonstration Schools attached to the Froebel Training College.

10. I have published a series of English Readers for Indian Schools which are used in several of the schools of this Province.

11. My only reason for wanting to leave Madras is, that I have reached the maximum salary of my appointment Rs 500/- and see no prospects of having it raised in this Province.

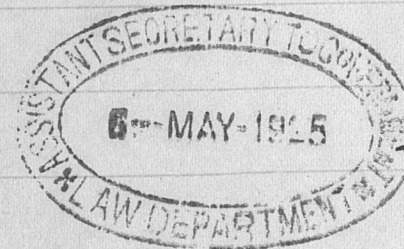

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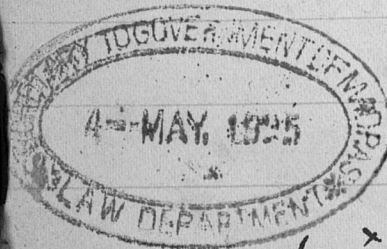
