1399. To reduce the allotment of Rs. 6,43,000 for Government Arts Colleges by Rs. 100.
(To consider the grievances of the Assistant Lecturers and Professors in the S. E. S.)

Prior to the introduction of the time scales of pay the Subordinate Educational Service consisted of two branches, the inspection branch and the collegiate branch. The present motion refers only to the latter. Mr. Ramachandra Reddi has given notice of a motion regarding the pay and prospects of the inspection branch and it has been noted on separately. The Collegiate branch consists of Assistant Lecturers employed in the various colleges. ^{Arts} They are generally recruited from Honours ^{to Merit} and M. A. s and do work for the Intermediate and B. A. classes. Before the revision, they were having grade rates of pay ranging from Rs. 125-250 exclusive of temporary pay. The Reforms Commissioner recommended a scale of pay of Rs. 125-5-175-7½-250 and this has been adopted.

2 Several memorials have been received by Government urging that this rate of pay is quite inadequate having regard to the qualifications of the members of the service and the work they are called upon to do. The pay of this branch of the service ^{has} ~~is~~ also formed the subject of interpellations in the Legislative Council. The last of the representations received by Government was in July 1924 when the D.P.I. submitted a memorandum presented by a deputation of the Non-Gazetted Educational Officers' Association representing their grievances and putting forward certain proposals purporting to be the minimum demands.

of the Association in respect of the pay and prospects of the several branches of the Subordinate Educational Service. As it was felt that orders on the Lee Commission Report would necessitate a change in the structure of the superior and subordinate branches of the Educational service it was ordered that the question of the revision of the pay of the subordinate educational service might be considered after orders on the Lee Commission Report were received.

3 Again, memorials were received from school assistants asking for an improvement in the rates of pay sanctioned for them. When the question of budget provision for extra expenditure on account of the revision of the subordinate service was raised, the Hon'ble the Minister ordered that the question might be examined so that the scheme might be ready for budget provision 1926-27.
