In paragraph 7 of its report, the Law College Reorganisation Committee recommended that, in addition to the ordinary lectures, special lectures should be delivered by men who were eminent in the legal profession and that ~~these~~ special lectures should form an integral part of the scheme of study in the College.

The Govt accepted the recommendation and directed that the special lectures should be selected by the College Council and ^{that} the ~~special~~ syllabus of lectures should be ~~selected~~ ^{approved} by the Council. The special lectures

are to be paid lump sum honoraria out of an allotment provided for the purpose in the budget, and the exact amount of honorarium ~~in each case~~ is to be settled in each case by the College Council.

2. When the question of provision for the special lectures in the Budget Estimate for 1925-26 was under consideration, it was first thought that a provision of Rs 10,000 for 200 lectures at the rate of Rs 50 for each lecture would suffice. Later on, the Hon'ble the Minister suggested that a sum of Rs 15,000 might be provided in the budget. The amount represents the cost of 300 lectures. This ~~amount~~ ^{amount} ~~provision~~ has been entered in the Budget Estimate for 1925-26. The estimate is provisional. The actual charges can be estimated only after some experience of the system of special lectures is gained. The provision to be made in future years may be adjusted with reference to the
