1354. To reduce the allotment of Rs.10,70,000 for grants to local bodies for secondary education by Rs.100

(To request the Education Minister to see that the Government bear the ~~total~~ net cost of at least one High school maintained by District Board in every Revenue taluk)

The total number of Board secondary schools in the Presidency is 164. Of these, 149 schools receive aid from Government in the shape either of full net cost or a portion of the net cost or of fixed subsidies.

Further, of the total expenditure of Rs.15.00 lakhs on Board secondary schools in 1923-24 provincial funds met 4.70 lakhs, fees 6.69 lakhs and local funds 3.61 lakhs.

Thus, it will be seen that almost all the schools under district boards receive aid from Government and that the amount spent from provincial funds on these schools is much larger than that from the Boards' funds. The M.L.Cs refer to ^{one high} school maintained by District Boards in every revenue taluk." In the first place, there ~~was~~ is no need to have, as a matter of course, a Board Secondary school in every revenue taluk. In many taluks the demand for secondary education may be met by schools under Municipal councils or under private management. In such cases, the District Board need not establish another school. As a general proposition, the suggestion of the M.L.Cs cannot be accepted. If in any ~~revenue~~ taluk there is demand for a secondary school and that no ~~suitable~~ suitable private management comes forward to open the school, the District board may formulate proposals for the establishment of a Board school. The

Government will then consider the question of ~~opening~~
 giving a subsidy to the school if the Board is unable
 to meet the cost from its own funds.
