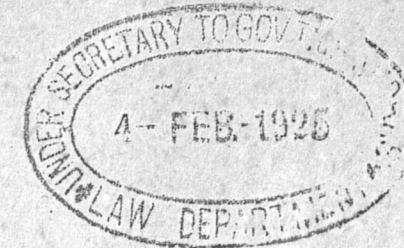

* 435 Q.—Mr. MUHAMMAD GHOUSE MIAN SAHIB: Will the hon. the Minister for Education be pleased to state whether it is not a fact that in cases where teachers in private services are served with notices to quit by the management, there is no appeal to the District Secondary Education Board?

A.—The answer is in the affirmative.

Mr. MUHAMMAD GHOUSE MIAN SAHIB:—"Has the board control over all schools within its jurisdiction?"

The hon. Rao Bahadur Sir A. P. PATRO:—"All schools within its jurisdiction."

Mr. MUHAMMAD GHOUSE MIAN SAHIB:—"Why should not such a power be given to these boards in cases where the management choose to dismiss arbitrarily any of the teachers?"

The hon. Rao Bahadur Sir A. P. PATRO:—"It will interfere with the judgment of the private bodies. They must have full freedom to making their own arrangements."

Mr. MUHAMMAD GHOUSE MIAN SAHIB:—"Is the Board given the power of hearing appeals against the orders of private managements?"

The hon. Rao Bahadur Sir A. P. PATRO:—"Yes, but the management will be consulted before any step is taken in the matter of allowing an appeal against their orders."

Mr. C. V. VENKATARAMANA AYYANGAR:—"Will the hon. the Minister consider the advisability of consulting the Secondary Education Board and the Teachers' Associations also before consulting the management in the matter?"

The hon. Rao Bahadur Sir A. P. PATRO:—"That is what the hon. Member from Trichinopoly suggested."
