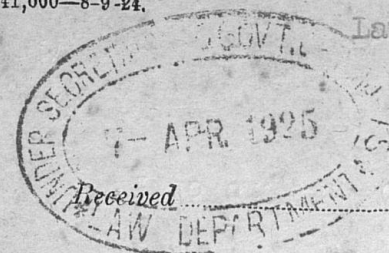

In G.O.No.718 Law(Education) dated 8th May 1924, M.R.Ry.D.Sadasiva Reddi was permitted to sell his motor cycle and to utilise the sale proceeds towards the purchase of a new conveyance. --- Mr.Sadasiva Reddi ^{now} proposes to dispose of the cycle by means of a raffle and requests sanction of Govt for the same. It is doubtful whether the proposed raffle should be placed in the same category as a 'lottery', which is generally discouraged by the State. 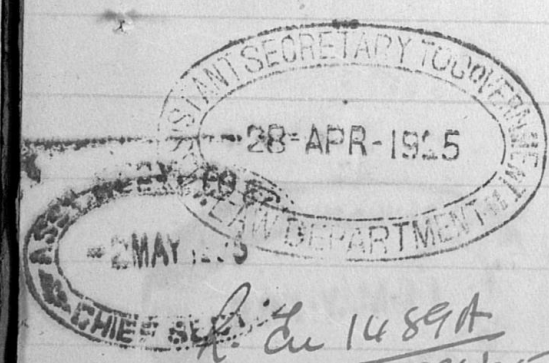
