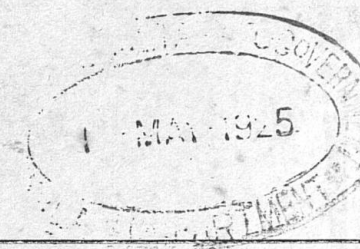

Sir,

I have the honour to submit herewith a copy of
the Accountant General's letter No. Edn. 1.639 dated 11-9-24
asking me why the abolition of the two posts of Secondary
grade teachers in the Government Secondary Schools for
Girls, Salem ordered in G.O. No. Misc. 646 Law(Education) dated
29-4-24 was not given effect to immediately on receipt
of the orders and to state as follows.

It will be seen from the Director's letter R.C.
No. 1729 C/23 dated 21-9-23 read in the G.O. referred
to above that at the time when proposals for the opening
of Form VI were formulated, there were only 10 sections

in

in the school, ie one section in each class from class I to Form V. As the sanctioned staff consisted of 10 Secondary grade teachers and 1 graduate Assistant (in addition to the Headmistress), it was proposed that 2 posts of Secondary grade teachers, which were then considered to be in excess of requirements, should be abolished and that 2 graduate assistants might be sanctioned in their place to do the work of the three higher classes including the proposed sixth form. Government accepted the proposal to abolish the two posts of Secondary grade teachers, but declined to sanction the additional staff required for the higher classes. By the time these orders were received, there were 12 sections in the school including two sections each in

the usual one months notice. The Inspectress of the circle therefore considered that she could not give effect to the G.O immediately on receipt of it. Her action was wholly irregular but in the circumstances detailed above and especially in view of the fact that one of the posts of secondary grade teacher had to be reviewed (vide G.O.No.1555 Law(Education) Mis dated 7-10-24)

I request that Government will be pleased to condone

condone the irregularity and consider the posts in question as having been retained up to the end of June 1924 in the exigencies of ^{the} service.

(A) "With reference to your telephonic reply dated the 19th August stating that the abolition of the two posts of secondary grade teachers in the Government Girls' School, Salem referred to in G.O.No.Mis.646 L.E dated the 29th April 1924 was given effect to from 1-7-24, I have the honour to enquire as to why the abolition was not given effect to immediately on receipt of the orders in your office especially in view of the summer vacation intervening between 29- 4- 24 and 1- 7- 24. The names of teachers who held the two posts now abolished may be stated.

An early reply is requested."

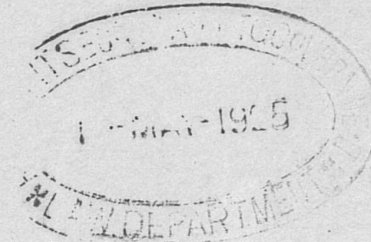
