Sir,

I have the honour to forward the accompanying memorial from Mr. M.D.Raghavan, my Personal Assistant and to recommend that his request may be complied with. I would in this connection invite a reference to Government Memorandum No. 307 C-1 dated 14th March 1924, stating that the extra expenditure involved in his deputation should be debited to the Museum Budget, and enquiring whether the expenditure can be met by re-appropriation within the Museum Budget for 1924-25. This was not possible as no special allotment for the purpose has been made. But it would appear therefrom that the Government had originally approved of the proposal to send him

him for training. In consideration therefore of his long service in the Secretariat, and in view of his special qualifications for appointments in the Revenue Department, I have to request that the Government will be pleased to reconsider their orders, and sanction his deputation to undergo the training at Government cost as a special case. I may mention that the extra cost will not be much, as in the event of his undergoing the course at his cost, taking leave for the purpose, to which presumably Government have no objection, a substitute will have to be provided, on the minimum pay of the appointment, Rs. 125/- per mensem, for the whole period of his absence. It also seems to me that this office should have as much claim as other offices, such as the Madras Record Office and the office of the Director of Fisheries, for inclusion in the list of offices eligible for Revenue training. I do not intend to raise the general question in this connection, but would respectfully submit that Mr. Raghavan's case deserves special consideration.

Sir,

I beg to request reconsideration of the orders in G.O. No. 1279 Law (Education) dated 6th August 1924, declining to permit me to undergo the Survey and Revenue Inspector's training at the cost of Government and to bring the following facts to the notice of the Government.

My present pay is Rs. 192/- in the scale of Rs. 100-10-200 with temporary allowance, and in the ordinary course, I shall draw the maximum in four years when my age will be 37 years. Once I reach the maximum there is no opening for further promotion for me and shall therefore have to continue in the pay until I retire about 20 years hence. I respectfully submit that this is hard and my endeavour is to prevent the stagnancy by qualifying myself for appointments in the Revenue Department for which the only qualification that I now lack is the Survey and Revenue Inspector's training.

I may in this connection invite attention to the fact that the members of the ministerial staff in the Madras Record Office, offices of the Director of Fisheries and of the Chief Conservator of Forests are permitted to undergo training at the cost of Government. Members of other offices such as the High Court, Director of Public Instruction, Inspector-General of Registration, Prisons, Police etc. have prospects of promotion in the departments which are denied to me. In the circumstances I request that I may be permitted to undergo the training at the cost of Government during the official year 1925-26.

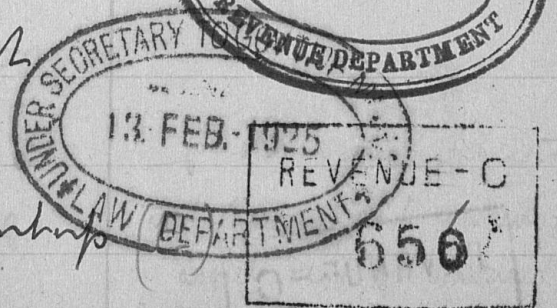
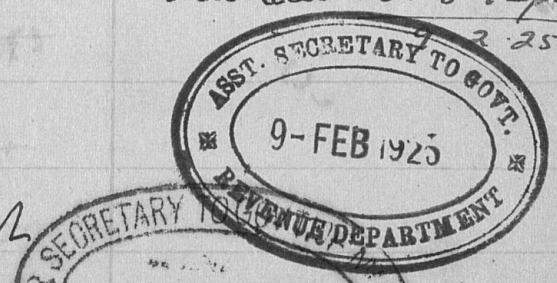

The previous application of Mr. Raghuram to undergo the Survey and the Revenue Inspector's training at the cost of Government was disposed of in G.O. No. 1279 Law (Edn), d/ 6th August 1924. The request was supported in this Dept. but Finance objected to its being complied with on the ground that he is not in one of the offices to which the concession is applicable. ~~under~~ Vide Annexure to the G.C. (D) G.O. No. 1363 Rev., d/ 10th Sep. 1923. As to this, the Supdt., Govt. Museum, observes that work in the Museum office is not different from that in the offices of the ~~Assistant~~ Director of Agriculture ~~Inspector~~ the Chief Conservator of Forests and the Madras Record Office all of which enjoy the privilege of sending out their subordinates for Survey & Revenue Inspector's training. The Supdt. however does not wish to raise this general question now but asks for a special concession in favour of Mr. Raghuram.

(The Commissioner of Revenue has raised the question of his clerks being permitted to undergo Survey & Tg. & this is under consideration in Revenue)

The file may be sent to Finance through Revenue for reconsideration of the previous decision.

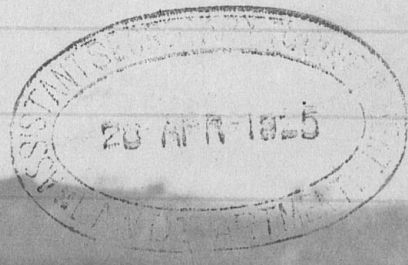

At that time his Secret. pay was Rs 60; and as Personal Asst. to the Museum Supdt., he got Rs 100 to begin with besides free quarters. The point of the present application is that he has no further prospects in the Museum and that his present position in the Museum is a sort of cul de sac which does not lead anywhere. ^{continued} ~~He~~ he in the Secret. he could reasonably have hoped for a Supdt's place at Rs 200-250-400. He accordingly asks that by a special dispensation in his favour he may be enabled to qualify himself for higher appointments in the Revenue Dept.
