BACK PAPERS.

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Copy of letter from the President, Y adhava Conference,

Guindy., dated 20th April 1925:-

I enclose herewith copy of the resolutions passed at the
Yadhava Conference at Guindy on the 12th inst, for your sympathe-
tic and favourable considerations.

(1) Resolved that the Conference expresses its loyalty to the crown and gratitude to the Government for its sympathetic attitude towards the community.

(2) Resolved that the Madras Government be requested to see that the existing rules granting "Half fees" to Yadava students be put into force without any reservation subject of course to the consideration of producing a poverty certificate, and in addition, to grant adequate number of Government Scholarships to deserving Yadava students in High Schools and Colleges.

(3) Resolved that the Government be requested to allot sufficient pasture lands for ^{grazing} ~~grazing~~ purposes in all the villages where there are none in existence, and to retain the existing ones for grazing purposes alone without converting them for other purposes.

(4) Resolved that the Government and the Municipal Corporation be requested to reduce the present abnormally heavy rates of license fees for the Cattle and for cattlesheds.

(5) Resolved that the Government be requested to put an end to the present practice by which owners of cattle are subjected to the double punishment of being held liable to pay a penalty for their stray cattle and of being further prosecuted for allowing them to stray.

(6) Resolved that the Madras Government be requested to ascertain and scrutinise the various charities and endowments left by Yadavas in the city and mofussil (not covered by the Religious Endowment Act) with a view to effect proper management by the representatives of this community, and to safeguard the Mirasi and other rights of the Yadavas in the various temples.

(7) Resolved that the Government be requested to nominate Yadava members in proportion to their numerical strength to Local Boards, Municipal, Educational & Legislative Councils, Temple Committees etc.

(8) Resolved that the Government be requested to show encouragement to educated Yadavas by allowing them adequate repre-

- (8) Resolved that the Government be requested to show encouragement to educated Yadavas by allowing them adequate representation in the various Departments.

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(9) Resolved that a deputation shall wait upon H.E. the Governor of Madras and the Chief Minister with a request to redress the grievances of the educated members of the community in respect of appointments in public services.

(10) Resolved that the Government be requested to recognise the claims of Yadava Community in the Central Board of Religious Endowments in view of the large number of charities and endowments for temples ^{owned} by this community in South India.

There are already a large number of scholarships tenable in schools and colleges open to all communities and these are generally awarded to poor and ~~deserving~~ ^{deserving} students. No action is called for with reference to the resolution.

If any ~~member~~ member of the Yadhava Community is fit to be nominated to the District Educational Board, his claims will naturally be brought to the notice of Govt. by the Presidents of D.E.Cs. Representation on District Secondary Education Boards does not proceed on a communal basis. Nominations to these Boards are so made as to secure due representation of the educational "interests".
