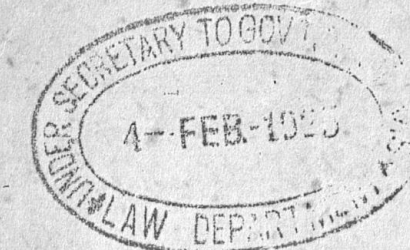

The Secondary School Leaving Certificate

"We have discussed the constitution of the Board and are agreed that it should consist partly of officials and partly of non-officials and that the majority of both should have had as much experience of secondary school work as possible. ~~There is no~~ rule that Head Masters alone should be appointed as members of the Board.

2. The following draft answer is for

approval:-

(a) The Board consists of ~~both~~ ^{five} officials and non-officials. Two officials and two non-officials are appointed on the recommendation of the Syndicate. The members are so chosen that the principal subjects of the public examination under the S.S.L.C. scheme are ordinarily represented on the Board. Care is also taken to see that the majority of the members have as much experience of secondary school work as possible."

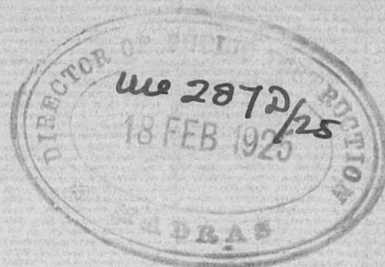

Minister for Education be pleased to state—

by 'subjects being represented on the Board'?"

A and C, compulsory as well as optional, are represented by various
representatives."
