Read the following letter from H. SEWELL, Esq., Acting Collector of Trichinopoly, to H. E. STOKES, Esq., Acting Secretary to the Board of Revenue, dated Trichinopoly, 30th November 1875, No. 336:—

I have the honor to submit, for the Board's consideration, the correspondence noted in the margin regarding the issue of 70 Sovereigns to the public of (70) seventy Sovereigns now on hand in the District Treasury.

2. The Sovereigns in question were received from the Session Judge in connection with Session Case No. 13 of 1875, and were, at the Session Judge's request, carried to the credit of Government under "Law and Justice," "Other Items."

3. The Accountant-General is of opinion, in reply to the reference made to him, that the Sovereigns must be issued to the public in payment of Government dues at Rupees 10-4-0 per Sovereign, under Notification of Government of India, No. 3287, dated 28th October 1868. The market rate, however, in Trichinopoly ranges from Rupees 10-12-0 to Rupees 11 per Pound, and the issue of the Sovereigns at Rupees 10-4-0 per Pound would amount to their offer to the public at a discount of between 4-8 and 6-8 per cent.

4. I have the honor, therefore, to request the favor of the Board's views as to the rate at which the Sovereigns are to be issued to the public, the Accountant-General's rate yielding to any one drawing the Sovereigns from the Treasury a clear profit of from 35 to 52 Rupees on the whole amount.

From H. SEWELL, Esq., Acting Collector of Trichinopoly, to R. W. LODWICK, Esq., Accountant-General, Fort St. George, dated Trichinopoly, 17th November 1875, No. 14.

On the 10th July 1875 the Sessions Judge remitted Rupees 947-8-0 as per margin in connection with Sessions Case No. 18 of 1875,

and requested the money to be held in deposit. The money was in safe custody in the Treasury till the 2nd August following, when, as requested by the Sessions Judge, the amount was carried to the credit of Government under the head "Law and Justice," "Other items."

2. I have now the honor to inquire whether the Sovereigns can be issued to the public, if so whether they are to be issued at the rate of Rupees 10-4-0 per Pound in payment of claims against Government, or whether they are to be disposed of at the market rate which ranges from Rupees 10-12-0 to Rupees 11 per Pound.

No. 116. MEMORANDUM.

The undersigned has the honor to report that under the Notification of the Government of India, No. 3287, dated 28th October 1868, Sovereigns and half Sovereigns whenever available at any Government Treasury are to be issued to the public in payment of Government demands at Rupees 10-4-0 and Rupees 5-2-0 respectively, and no subsequent orders in modification of the above instructions having been received, the Collector of Trichinopoly was directed to issue the coins at the above rates in the terms of the said Notification.

2. It is further to be observed that in the recent Circular, No. 18, dated 18th August 1874, issued by the Comptroller-General the Treasury Officers were authorized to receive the gold coins only at the rates above mentioned.
