No. 143. Read the following Proceedings of the Board of Revenue, dated 24th January 1876 :—

Read the following letter from Surgeon-Major G. BIDIE, M.B., Secretary to the Surgeon-General, Indian Medical Department, to H. E. STOKES, Esq., Acting Secretary to the Board of Revenue, dated Fort St. George, 19th January 1876, No. 439 :—

I have the honor, by desire of the Surgeon-General, to submit to your Board the following review of Grant III. of the Budget Estimate for 1876-77 of the Local Fund Board, Salem Circle.

2. The contribution of Rupees 2,000 in aid of the Salem Dispensary will be sufficient.

3. *Namcul.*—In the allotment for this dispensary a sum of Rupees 720 is provided for the pay of the medical subordinate, but the sum of Rupees 480 will be sufficient, as a second-class Hospital Assistant has recently been put in charge in consequence of the death of the Assistant-Apothecary D'Castro. The other items of the provision for this hospital do not require any special notice.

4. *Tripatore.*—The allotment for this dispensary will suffice.

5. *Athur.*—The provision for this hospital is ample.

6. *Senkerrydroog.*—It is proposed to open a dispensary at this station. The salary allotted for a medical attendant is that of a first-class Hospital Assistant, but it is questionable if one will be available. The grant for medicines and instruments is insufficient. The other items call for no remarks.

7. *Haroor.*—The establishment of a dispensary at this place is also contemplated, and provision has been made for a first-class Hospital Assistant to take charge, but it is impossible to say whether or not a subordinate of this or any other grade will be available. The allotment as a whole is satisfactory.

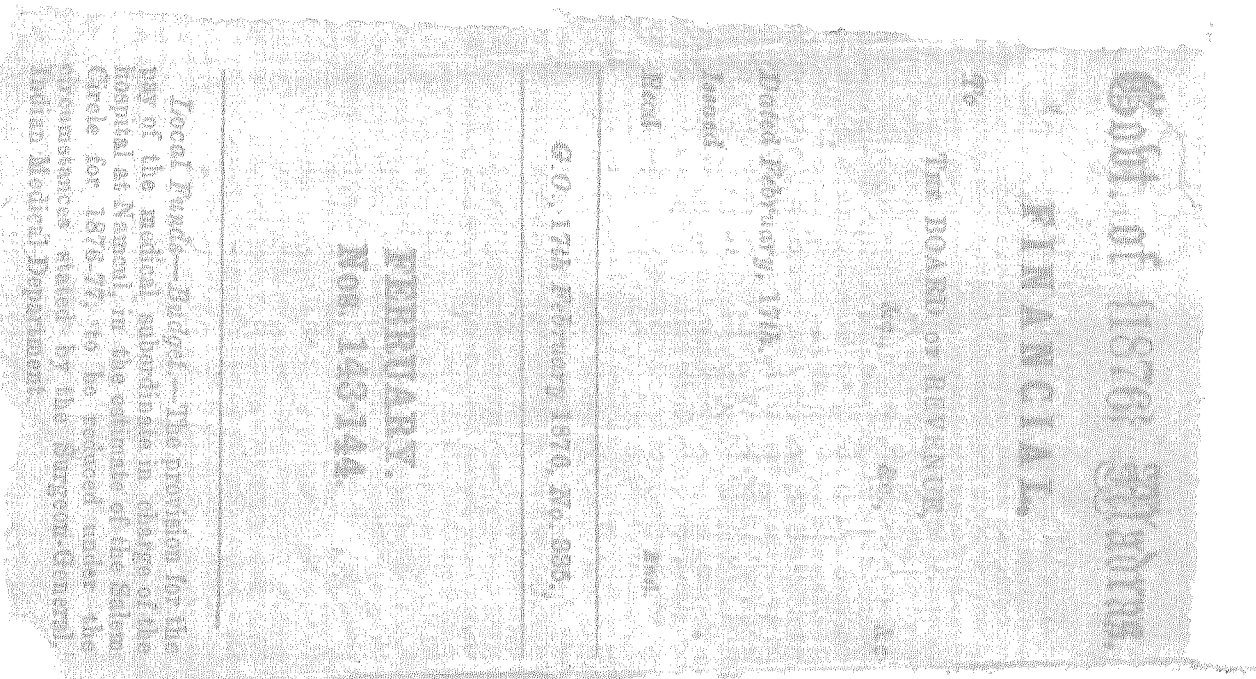
