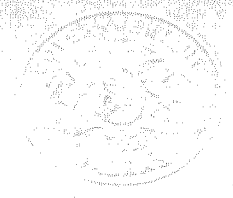

On consideration of the figures relating to our Provincial allotment for Police and especially to the consequence of our voluntarily assuming the Charges for Town police subsequently to the introduction of the system of Provincial assignments whereby we of our own act relinquished to Municipalities between 2 and 3 lacs of Rupees yearly received previously towards Police charges - I do not think we can make out a case for asking Govt. of India for a special grant for Salt guards in as much as we are not spending on our Police

be avoided - but the matter
is one for serious consideration

I doubt whether the Police
Budget can stand these

The marginal statement
shows the gradual increments
under this head. The charge
has increased by 11 per cent in 5 years. I would
not sanction further increases
pending the report of the Salt Commission.

Where attention should be drawn to the
Subject, without however noticing that our
action in respect to relinquishment in favor
of towns probably precludes application to the
Government of India for further grants.
