No. 183. Read the following letter from R. W. LODWICK, Esq., Accountant-General, to the Hon. W. HUDLESTON, Chief Secretary to Government, Fort St. George, dated Fort St. George, 17th February 1876, No. 711:—

Audit Department.

I have the honor to state that, as the Comptroller-General in his Circular No. 223 of the 17th December last, has prescribed a new form of Register for the Audit of Establishments, in which only the total of the different sections of establishments will be shown, without the names of incumbents, this office will not, from April next, be in a position to check appointments made in opposition to the Examination Rules, nor will it be called on hereafter to check the nature or period of absence on leave granted by Heads of Departments to public servants on Ministerial Establishments, the following certificate to be attached to leave statements accompanying the Pay Abstracts being held sufficient for audit purposes:—

“Certified that all leaves granted to any person in superior service on this establishment and the total absence on such leave, or without leave during the month, and temporary appointments and promotions consequent on such absence, are detailed in the above statement, that no leave has been granted, until, by reference to the applicant's Service Book and to the Civil Leave Code, I had satisfied myself that it was admissible; and further that all grants of leave, and departures on, and return from leave, and all appointments and promotions, temporary or permanent, have been recorded in the Service Book of the persons concerned under my initials.”

2. I report this change to Government in order that, should it be considered advisable to do so, stringent orders may be issued to Heads of Departments regarding appointments of unpassed men. This office will add a clause to the above certificate to the effect that the Examination Rules of the Local Government have been strictly attended to.

No. 184. ORDER THEREON, 21st February 1876, No. 367.

The Governor in Council approves the addition of a clause to the certificate to the effect that no appointment has been made otherwise than in accordance with Examination Rules, except with the sanction of Government conveyed by the Government Order attached to the bill.
