I have the honor to forward, for the information of Government, copy of a letter from the Financial Secretary to the Government of India on the subject of Subsidiary leave, and would beg to suggest, as the ruling appears to be of general application, that Government notify in the Gazette that for the future they will give the "usual subsidiary leave" to all officers applying for subsidiary leave when proceeding on furlough, as such grant applies to subsidiary leave both before and after furlough, leaving it to the officers concerned to take the whole or as little of the subsidiary leave as they may choose.
