Read the following letter from J. H. GARSTIN, Esq., President of the Local Fund Boards, South Arcot District, to H. E. STOKES, Esq., Acting Secretary to the Board of Revenue, dated Cuddalore, 1st December 1875, No. 107:—

The Local Fund Board of the Virdachellum Circle having resolved, on the proposal of the Inspector and the Deputy Inspector of Schools, to open five new schools at the places noted in the margin on the same standard as the eight new schools sanctioned by Government in their Proceedings, dated 29th January 1875, No. 171, I have the honor to request that the sanction of Government may be obtained for the same.

2. Provision for meeting the cost of these five schools is made in the Budget of the Circle for the year 1876-77.

3. I enclose a copy of the Local Fund Board's resolution on the subject for the Board's perusal.

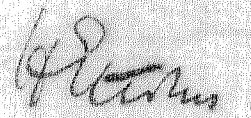
