No. 207. Read the following letter from R. B. CHAPMAN, Esq., Secretary to the Government of India, Financial Department, to the Honorable W. HUDLESTON, Chief Secretary to Government, Fort St. George, dated Fort William, 17th February 1876, No. 1003 :—

In continuation of my letter, No. 4281, dated 28th October last, I am directed to request that, with the permission of His Grace the Governor in Council, the Trustees of the Madras Civil Fund may be informed that the Secretary of State has intimated his intention of reserving his decision upon the recommendations made by the Government of India in their Despatch, No. 387, dated 28th October, until after receipt of the views of the Trustees, with the remarks of the Government of India upon them. The Government of India will be glad to learn the views of the Trustees as soon as they are matured.

2. Meanwhile, the Secretary of State has desired the Government of India to make no alteration in the course hitherto pursued. The fixed donation, donation interest and donation exchange, will therefore be disbursed as heretofore, but without prejudice to the claims of the Government of India to cease further payments to the Fund as no longer necessary from the date of the Despatch No. 387, above quoted.

3. This claim will be disposed of hereafter by the Secretary of State in his decision upon the whole case, and accounts can eventually be adjusted between the Fund and the Government accordingly.

Copy to the Accountant-General, Madras, who will disburse to the Fund all sums held in suspense under previous orders, and resume payment to the Fund as heretofore.
