Read Budget Estimate of the Local Fund Audit Establishment in the Office of the Accountant-General, Madras, for the year 1881-82.

No. 107. ORDER THEREON, 28th January 1881, No. 168.

This budget contains several unauthorized items and is returned for revision.

2. The entries against Salaries of Auditor and Inspector and Assistants agree with the amounts sanctioned in G.O., 22nd March 1880, No. 602, and are passed for the budget. It is, however, observed that as per the Accountant-General's letter in G.O., 11th August 1880, No. 1554, the whole amount of Rs. 12,000 for the Auditor is not yet utilised, but only Rs. 8,640.

3. The provision for Clerks is Rs. 10,248 against Rs. 5,500. The Government distinctly declined in G.O., 13th August 1880, No. 1560, to sanction establishments in excess of the amount just mentioned. It is observed that no reply has yet been sent to paragraph 15 of G.O., 22nd March 1880, No. 609, which may possibly account in some measure for the error.

4. The entry against "Servants" is Rs. 408, whereas the sanctioned charge as per G.O., 24th December 1880, No. 2373, is Rs. 288, and even the latter charge was sanctioned on the express understanding that it was to be covered by the savings in the sanctioned graduated scale for clerks.

5. Under Office Contingencies the item, "Those admissible without detailed audit, Rs. 750," is not understood. Among charges provided for as those subject to regular audit the following are passed:—
