Famine Expenditure.

Read the following paper :—

No. 9. From W. DONALD, Esq., Officiating Accountant-General, to the Chief Secretary to Government, dated Fort St. George, 20th December 1880, No. 4812.

Book Department.

With reference to the Proceedings of Government, Financial Department, No. 1360, dated the 15th of July 1880, I have the honor to state that, in communication with the Collector of Cuddapah, the abstract statements of compensation for lands taken up for famine roads in the Cuddapah District have been examined with the detailed statements furnished by the Collector, and with a few exceptions the figures in the abstract have been found correct.

2. I enclose an abstract statement prepared by the Collector and checked by this office, showing in juxtaposition the figures recorded in the Proceedings of Government and those arrived at by this office from a summation of the figures in the detailed statements. From this, it will be observed that the assessments on lands to be given in lieu of those taken is Rs. 100-0-4, the reduction of quit-rent Rs. 130-5-10, and the compensation to be awarded Rs. 10,626-5-11. The discrepancies, I beg to remark, were mainly caused by erroneous totals in the detailed statements.

3. The examination in this office of the statements was only an arithmetical one, as I have no means of checking the details given.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF REVENUE, dated 26th November 1880.

Read the following letter from Surgeon A. J. STURMER, Secretary, Surgeon-General with the Government of Madras, to C. A. GALTON, Esq., Secretary to the Board of Revenue, dated Fort St. George, 10th November 1880, No. 6,196:—

I HAVE the honor, by desire of the Surgeon-General, to request the attention of your Board to the subject of leave of absence to Medical Subordinates in charge of Local Fund and Municipal Hospitals.

2. At present there does not appear to be any well-defined rule as to the party who is authorized to grant leave to such subordinates, and in practice there is no uniformity; sometimes the President grants the leave, at other times the Vice-President. Leave in some cases is given in communication with this Office, and in others it is granted without the knowledge of this Office, and from the varying practice the Medical Department occasionally loses sight of some of its members for months together to the great inconvenience of the work of this department.

3. By G.O., No. 1,628, of the 9th August 1875, copy of which is enclosed for perusal, the Surgeon-General is constituted the authority to grant leave to Medical Subordinates employed under Municipal and Local Fund Boards with the proviso that such leave shall not be granted without previous consultation with the Presidents of those Boards; but the Surgeon-General is of opinion that it would be a preferable arrangement if the Presidents who have a local knowledge of the circumstances were invested with the power to grant leave to subordinates who for the time being are in the position of private servants of those bodies, provided that in all cases in which it is proposed to grant leave to Government Medical Subordinates temporarily lent to Municipalities and Local Fund Boards, the Surgeon-General be consulted through the District Medical Officer.

In the case of those who are not Government servants, it will suffice if Presidents, before granting leave, consult the District Medical Officer under whose professional supervision the hospital lies.

4. If your Board concur in these views, the Surgeon-General will feel obliged if they will be so good as to obtain the decision of Government on the subject.

 In 309 August 1875 No 1628.
 it was decided that no leave
 should be granted by the
 Surgeon Genl to medical
 subordinates employed under
 Local F&D Municipal boards
 without previous consultation
 with the Presidents of those
 boards. Now the complaint
 is made that Presidents
 grant the leave without
 consulting the medical
 authorities & that no parti-
 cular rule is followed in the
 grant of leaves to the employees
 referred to. The Surgeon General

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suggests that

1. in the case of medical subordi-
nates who are not government
servants, the President should
before granting the leave, consult
the District Medical Officer
having the supervision of the
Hospital.

2. in the case of medical
subordinates temporarily
lent to municipalities &
L.P. boards, the Surgeon General
should be consulted through
the D.O. Medical Officer.

The Board of Health recommended
the adoption of the suggestions.
