MY LORD DUKE,—I have considered in Council your Financial letter, No. 21, dated 9th July last, forwarding an indent for 345 reams of pink blotting paper.

2. I have sanctioned the indent, and have directed that the paper be procured and despatched so as to reach Madras, if possible, by January next.

3. With regard to the complaints as to the quality of pink blotting paper last supplied by Her Majesty's Stationery Office, I am assured that this paper was of excellent quality of its kind, but that it was a light paper, weighing only 18 lb. per ream, in accordance with the price estimated in the indent (9s. 11d.).

4. As it is probable that a slightly heavier paper would be better suited for Indian service, I have, on this occasion, directed the supply of paper weighing 23 lb. per ream.

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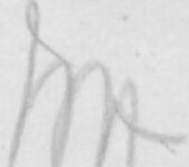
