No. 25. From P. RATNAVELU CHETTI, Esq., Acting Head Assistant Collector, to the Collector of Malabar, Calicut, dated Palghat, 4th December 1880, No. 1332.

I have the honor to forward an objection statement received from the Accountant-General through my Agents, and to request you will kindly submit it for the favorable consideration of Government in reference to paragraph 3 :—

" Mr. Ratnavelu Chettiar having acted for Mr. Hamnett during his employment on other duty is not entitled to fixed tentage allowance, as the Government of India Order distinctly limits the allowance to deputation for an officer on privilege leave. If the special orders of Government are obtained, the allowance claimed will be passed."

2. The Accountant-General retrenches my fixed tentage on the ground that the permanent incumbent, Mr. Hamnett, was employed on other duty. Whatever he may have been doing, I had to maintain the necessary equipment of tents. As a matter of fact, I not only maintained them but bought an additional hill-tent with its adjuncts to serve me in the Kurnool District which I inspected. My marches were long and the roads unadapted to rapid travelling, so I had to keep two complete sets.

3. The Government are aware that I had to join my acting appointment of Inspector-General of Registration at a day's notice, going all the way from Malapuram, that while I was holding that appointment I was constantly travelling. When I was relieved, I had to return all the way to my present station, incurring considerable expense each way. It is a great hardship, therefore, to be denied an allowance which I would have drawn if I had remained all the time at one and the same station.

Read the following paper:—

No. 33. From E. J. SINKINSON, Esq., Under Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Finance, to the Acting Chief Secretary to Government, dated Fort William, 24th December 1879, No. 1968.

With reference to the correspondence ending with your letter, No. 1494, dated the 10th October 1879, I am directed to say that the Governor-General in Council confirms, with retrospective effect, the Order of the Government of Madras, No. 1658, dated the 20th July 1867, that an officer who is entitled to tentage shall not forfeit it on his deputation to act for another officer absent on privilege leave, who is not entitled to tentage.

2. This concession must, however, be subject to the proviso that the Acting Officer actually keeps up his tents, and that no other officer draws tentage in virtue of his use of the same tents.

3. The case of Mr. Crole, Acting Collector of Sea Customs, Madras, referred to in the Proceedings of the Government of Madras, Public Department, No. 1150, dated the 25th July 1879, may be disposed of accordingly.

I have the honor to request that the Government may be pleased to pass orders sanctioning the payment to me of the fixed tentage of my rank during the time of my employment to act for the Collector of Sea Customs on privilege leave.

With reference to your endorsement, No. 1344, dated the 3rd July 1879, I have the honor to state that in the Proceedings of Government, Revenue, No. 1658, dated 20th July 1867, it was ruled that the temporary employment of an officer in an office where tents are not required should not deprive him of the fixed tentage attaching to his substantive appointment, provided he reverts to it after three months' absence at most. It would seem, however, that this ruling must be considered as having been superseded by the Civil Leave Code, as the Government of India have had the subject of fixed tentage to Madras Civilians before them on several occasions, and the provisions of the order referred to are not inserted in the code. In these circumstances, Mr. Crole appears not to be entitled to the fixed tentage of Rupees 87-8-0 during the period he acts for Mr. Melville, as under Section I of the Civil Leave Code no rule or regulation of any other authority can be considered valid after the publication of the code till it is confirmed by the Government of India. The above mentioned Government Order can therefore not be considered to be in force now unless the Government of India upon the representation of His Grace the Governor in Council should see fit to authorize its continuance and its incorporation in the code.
