No. 37. *From R. B. CHAPMAN, Esq., Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Finance and Commerce (Accounts and Finance), to the Chief Commissioner of Assam, dated Fort William, 11th February 1881, No. 540.*

I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter, No. 4275, dated the 28th December 1880, proposing to debit the salary of the Judge and Commissioner of the Assam Valley Districts in equal proportions to "19, Law and Justice" and "17, Administration," on the ground that that officer's time and responsibility are nearly equally divided between his judicial and executive functions.

2. The Governor-General in Council sees no sufficient reason for the proposed division of charge between the two heads "Law and Justice" and "Administration." The salaries of Commissioners who elsewhere have judicial functions are shown wholly under "Administration," and the salary of the Commissioner and Judge of the Assam Valley Districts should be similarly treated.

3. I am to add that questions of this kind, relating simply to the classification of the accounts, should be submitted by the Comptroller to the Comptroller-General for decision, and not referred to the Government of India at all, unless the Comptroller-General is in doubt, or the Local Government does not accept the Comptroller-General's view.

SIR,

I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 4275, dated the 28th December 1880, proposing to debit the salary of the Judge and Commissioner of the Assam Valley Districts in equal proportions to "19. Law and Justice" and "17. Administration," on the ground that that officer's time and responsibility are nearly equally divided between his judicial and executive functions.

2. The Governor General in Council sees no sufficient reason for the proposed division of charge between the two heads "Law and Justice" and "Administration." The salaries of Commissioners who elsewhere have judicial functions are shown wholly under "Administration," and the salary of the Commissioner and Judge of the Assam Valley Districts should be similarly treated.

3. I am to add that questions of this kind, relating simply to the classification of the Accounts, should be submitted by the Comptroller to the Comptroller General for decision, and not referred to the Government of India at all, unless the Comptroller General is in doubt, or the Local Government does not accept the Comptroller General's view.
