Extract from the Minutes Consultation under date the 8th January 1857.

Read the following letter from A. S. MATHISON, Esq., Civil and Session Judge of Chittoor.

Applying for leave to England for three years on Private Affairs, and for one month preparatory leave to Madras. } (Here enter 1st January 1857, No. 35.)

Mr. A. S. Mathison, Civil and Session Judge of Chittoor, is permitted to proceed to Europe with leave of absence on private affairs for three years, resigning his appointment from the date of embarkation.

2. Mr. Mathison is also authorized to deliver over charge of his Court to the Subordinate Judge, and to proceed to the Presidency for the purpose of embarking. It would seem however from the Civil Auditor's Report—copy of which will be furnished to him, that he is not entitled to leave under the Rules—with retention of any part of his official emoluments.

Read the following Report from F. LUSHINGTON, Esq., Civil Auditor; to T. PYCROFT, Esq., Chief Secretary, dated 6th January 1857, No. 2304.

The Civil Auditor has the honor to report that, he is not aware of any objection to the grant of leave of absence for 3 years to Mr. A. S. Mathison, Civil and Session Judge of Chittoor, to proceed to Europe on private affairs resigning his appointment.

2. With reference to that Officer's request for preparatory leave for one month to proceed to Madras under the Notification of the Government of India, No. 51, dated the 14th November last, the Civil Auditor begs to observe that, that Notification does not appear to him to be applicable to the case of Mr. Mathison, who has already had his Furlough for 3 years on £ 500 per annum under the old Rules, and has moreover exhausted his six months special leave under the present Rules, granted to him on the 22nd January last.

3. Mr. Mathison however has had neither indulgence leave, nor sick leave during the last two years; but as in the present instance he cannot "rejoin his appointment," leave cannot be granted to him under Section XII agreeably to 1st para: of the Notification of the Government of India, dated the 11th July 1856.
