Sir.

I have the honor to request you will be so good as to let me know for the information of Government how recruit C. Kuppuswami, No. 2072, who was enlisted in your regiment in November 1892, is behaving and whether he is giving satisfaction, and what is his present rank.

2. Kuppuswami was an exceedingly well behaved lad in this school. He was trained in carpentry and became almost an expert in gymnastics. He passed also the Primary school examination and rose to be a monitor, a position conferred only on well behaved boys. He went to Bangalore and enlisted on my advice, as I expected that he would make a good native soldier. Government is aware of his enlistment; and four other lads trained in this school have also been enlisted in the Native army and they are also doing well.

If Kuppuswami is giving satisfaction, I have no reason to suspect that he is not, I purpose sending him his school certificate. I request also in this connection the favour of your informing me whether you can enlist a few more well-behaved lads trained in this school. I have now a lad trained in blacksmith's work, who is willing to enlist. Soliciting the favour of an early reply.
