Sir,

I have the honor to inform you that
I engaged a tonga or jutka with tonga
poles and harness for ponies from the
Carrying Company, to take me from Coimba-
-tore to Satyanaungalam on the 9th Instant.

2. If I had had, any idea of the Scanda-
-lous state of affairs now existing along this
road, I should have made other arrange-
-ments for my journey; but as I had made
previous journeys through this Company, and
as the first pair of ponies brought to my house
appeared to be equal to their work, I started,
and became a most unwilling participator
in the misery inflicted on the animals sub-
-sequently produced.

3. There is supposed to be a change of ponies
at every 7 miles; but the first pair travelled

putka at all - The next pair could hardly walk, and so on, for the best part of a long and tedious journey which occupied 12 hours.

4. I make no complaint, however, to you of the mere slowness of the travelling, but feel it my duty to bring to your notice the gross cruelty practised on the wretched ponies employed in the service - some can hardly walk, some are blind from savage beating over the eyes, most have open sores on them, those after the first stage are absolutely starved, and in nearly all cases, it is barbarity to use them, as they are quite unfit for work.

5. I do not know, if the putkas dragged by these poor creatures, are still running daily, but presume they are, and in that case, I hope you have the authority to order enquiries to be made as to the number of ponies this Company owns, really capable of performing their miserable task, and that those not equal to it, should be either

now existing, which may mean
when such animals are made to haul,
any pace, a putka laden with 6 or 8 passengers.

Sir,

I have the honor to forward, for
the orders of Government, a copy of a
letter from the District Forest Officer,
North Coimbatore, regarding the cruelty
practised by the owners of certain
public conveyances in this District.
I have not myself seen cruelty prac-
tised, but except in Kollegal Taluk
I have not travelled by a public
conveyance. Inquiries, however,
show that a great deal of cruelty
goes on and that the proprietors
of the transits take good care to use

Act is in force.

2. The only remedy that I can see is to extend section 5 of the Act to the principal transit lines in this district. ^{x It relates to Penalty for cruelty to animals.} Should the Government approve of this proposal I will submitⁿ draft notification.
