Appealing against the appended order of the Inspector General
of Police Madras purporting that he sees no reason to interfere in
the Superintendent's minute confirmed by the D. I. G. as Petitioner
leaving the guard without permission is clearly proved.

MOST RESPECTFULLY SETS FORTH:—

That, while the humble Memorialist was in Arantangi Patukota Taluq
as Sub Treasury officer on the night of 25—3—94 a charge that petitioner left the
Treasury Guard without permission was concocted, and in virtue of it is the
petitioner from 20—4—94 reduced from the 4th Grade Head Constable to the
First class Constable.

2. That the petitioner does not deny the fact of his leaving the Guard;
but this admission cannot make him guilty, for he did not leave it without
permission; and the petitioner, as he has proved in his former appeals, has to
prove in this that he left the guard only after being properly relieved and there-
fore with due permission.

3. That the Parah book is the most important record to vindicate that
the station Head Constable No. 522 duly took charge of guard from petitioner and
relieved him. The petitioner on 5—6—94 requested the D. I. G. to call for the
said record which would verify the petitioner's innocence. But the said Head
Constable No. 522 coming to know the petitioner's request and finding that the
petitioner would be restored to his former Grade, should that record be produced,
has caused it to be said that as though the Parah book was missing.

4. That the said Head Constable No. 522 &c. have also reported that the
petitioner himself had secreted the said Parah book. The record on which the
petitioner solely relies cannot have been hid by the petitioner but by those who
work his ruin. The said Constable No. 522 &c. have besides kept back the duty
Roster and have not sent it too, which will also prove that Petitioner was relieved
by the said Head Constable NO. 522,

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :—

THAT, as prayed in his appeal petition dated 10—8—94 it pleased Your Honour to call for the records, viz, 1. Parah Book, 2. Station duty Roster, 3. Guard duty Roster, 4. Inspector's diary, 5. Punishment Roll, &c. and 6 reports &c, in support of petitioner's statements. But the Inspector has submitted, I learn, only the diary, and punishment Roll, reports &c. and kept back the Parah Book, station duty Roster. and guard duty Roster.

That on my appeal petition to D. I. G. on 5—6—94 the parah book that was kept on the table having no lock or key was on 6—6—94 missing and on the following day that Head Constable No. 522 said that it was found in the station, and I then and there reported the matter. I hear that the missing was caused it to appear as my fault and intended to ruin my interests. That, in support and proof of the parah book being found again, it may be said that no further procedure was made I was not examined nor called for an explanation till the present date. That, on 27—1—94 when the Constable No. 920 was asked a certain defence he added some other that required further explanation from me on the remark of the Inspector dated 28—1—94. The said explanation is attached to this. On that occasion when I asked for the parah book completed before 9—8—93 it was said that it could not be had. So in the explanation furnished by me I have clearly stated the concealing of the parah book. Thus it is usual with that station to conceal books as the like.

That, both in the present and past parah books I have reported about the Head Constable No. 522. To screen those reports the said Parah books are hidden. The said Head Constable No. 522 is always in the habit of concealing station records. Thus to find fault with me and to favour the Head Constable No. 522, such procedures are going on.

And that in conclusion therefore I beg Your Honour to be graciously pleased to peruse this along with my appeal petition dated 10—8—94 and do me justice.

That as the records are already submitted from the office to avoid delay I beg to submit this direct to Your Honor so that it may be viewed along with all of them.

5. That the Petitioner learning the Head Constable's Report submitted on 1—10—94 to the Inspector General a petition requesting him to call for the records; and when he sent for them the station officer reported that the petitioner himself had taken away the records. From these the gracious Government can infer that it is not the petitioner but his adversaries that should have hidden the records.

6. That had the petitioner really hid the parah book the said Head Constable &c. would have, when they concocted the charge against petitioner, reported this matter also to the Superintendent and the latter would have mentioned it in the minute.

7. That the charge concocted against the petitioner dates 25—3—94. The Inspector's diaries till he was called on by the Superintendent to get an explanation from the petitioner for leaving the Guard never state any irregularity on the part of the Petitioner. Thus on the Superintendent's interference the Inspector to screen Head Constable No. 522 has allowed all these false Reports to go on.

8. That such hiding of the Records goes on in that Station may be proved by the defense dated 27—1—94 given by the Inspector to Constable No. 920.

9. That in corroboration of the entries in the Parah book there is duty Roaster. On 25—3—94 the Head Constable No. 522 was to take charge from the Petitioner and relieve him. On 26—3—94 the next day to that on which the Petitioner was charged with leaving the Guard without permission, it is marked in the said duty Roaster that the Petitioner was on duty to the Inspector.

10. That cowardice imputed to the Petitioner by the minute is not taken as disproved and mentioned so in the orders by the appealed authorities Petitioner finds it unnecessary to state his reasons on the point which are at large stated in his Appeal Petition the I. G. of Police.

11. And that in conclusion the Petitioner begs the benign Government to be graciously pleased to take these as well as the other appeal petitions and the Petitioner's having no other defaulter than this originated from mistaken opinion reducing his pay from Rs. 14 to 8 into serious consideration and grant the petitioner's prayer that he be restored to his former 4th grade with arrears of pay.

For which act of kindness the Petitioner shall as in duty bound ever pray.

time, I have stated in my defence about the illness of my health and proved by my witnesses. When I left the Guard I have told the Constable No. 900 that I will come late by half an hour. It is usual in the Guard that we will come late by half or three fourth an hour; as it is usual there is no other default but this. Moreover, on the report of the Head Constable No. 165 the officer of the Guard about the other Constables for not coming to the Guard, not being dressed properly: there is no punishment for the Constables so reported up to this time. For the above report if the punishment had been duly given to the Constables, I and other Constables would have been properly done and strict. After I have come to this station I had been properly doing my Guard duties and other duties for about 7 or 8 months. I am not doing my duties to have been reported by the Station Officer and the Guard Officer up to this time that I am not properly doing my duties. To me who had been very correct in my duties as I was unable to undergo the difficulties occurred me, so on that account I had been absent only that high stated in the margin and I had not been lazy and indifferant; nor I had been of my own business. The fact that I did not come to school is known to the Constable No. 1173 who had been in charge that day. I was suffering very much by the beating of a scarpian on the night of 11-1-94. Yourself have examined the witnesses I have adduced about this.

The following reports were sent by me when I was in the Station and the Sub-Treasury charge and the Head-Constable No. 522 was acting as Division Inspector from 4-8-93 to 18-12-93.

30-6-93:—Report about the Constable No. 805 for taking off the sheep leather by a dog tied on the Eleva tree in the Parah opposite to the Guard.

6-7-93:—Report about the Constable No. 933 for his being absent for the 2nd Parah in the Sub-Treasury, and the Constable No. 400 who changed his turn for the Parah at 12 o'clock in the night and for coming late at 1-50 P. M. while he is to come at 12 in the noon for the 3rd Parah, and the same Constable after having kept the gun to the side of the door in the Sub-Treasury being in sleep without belt and turband.

9-7-93:—Report about the Constable No. 400 who changed the Parah of the Sub-Treasury after keeping the gun to the door being in bed in the varandah without belt and turband, and when I saw this at 3-15 A. M. I told some other Constables to awake him from sleep and the waiting Constable No. 1103 for his not coming to the Guard in the night.

4-8-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 920 for his being absent.

8-8-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 400 for his being absent in the 1st Parah in the Sub-Treasury Guard.

15-8-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 400 when he took charge of the Sub-Treasury Guard, for his being absent in the Parah going away to the market to buy vegetable.

21-8-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 1103 for changing his turn late by an hour and a half for the 3rd Parah.

23-8-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 400 for his neglecting to go to beet for Road No. 3 as appointed.

24-8-93:—Defence from Constable No. 400 was sent, who, on account of his illness having received a passport to the hospital and without entering himself as a sick man and returning the next day.

25-8-93:—Report was sent along with the report given by Constable No. 235 of Avidaiyarkoil who taking his bed in the Guard had fighting with the Constable No. 920, and when the Constable No. 235 gave his turband to the Constable No. 920. Constable No. 920 had eased in the turband and returned it to the Constable No. 235.

26-8-93:—Defence along with the report about the Constable No. 56 who went to the hospital on 22-8-93 and not entering himself as a sick man till 26-8-93.

28-8-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 525 who did not go to the beet for Road No. I.

3-9-93:—Defences about the Constable Nos. 591, 1103, 920, 400 were sent along with the report.

5-9-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 400 who did not go to the beet for Road No. III.

6-9-93:—Defence as to the absence of Constable No. 400.

8-9-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 920 who refused to rub the instruments for not giving him the beet-ticket.

10-9-93:—Defence about the Constable No. 920 who being absent after having gone to the beet for Road No. IV.

11—9—93 :—Defence as to the absence of Constable No. 1103 for the waiting in the Sub-Treasury.

16—9—93 :—Report and Defence about the Constable No. 920 who enlisting himself as a sick man in 12—9—93 absenting himself for the whole day in 13-9-93 and in the morning in 14—9—93, and the Constable No. 631 having refused to go to the beet and gone absent, and the Constable No. 1103 the 3rd Parah in the Sub-Treasury having been absent and come late by 1-5, and the Constable Nos. 400, 933 who had been appointed for the waiting did not come the whole night to the Guard.

20—9—93 :—Report, when the Constable No. 235 had come to the kusbah who had been appointed to take the accused to Pattukottai from Avidaiyarkoil along with the Constable No. 1173 had refused to go and returned back.

21—9—93 :—Defence about the Constable No. 591; and the Constable No. 920 abusing the Head Constable No. 216 and a defence about the Constable Nos. 706, 805, 920, along with the cheque report on 2—7—93 and a defence of Constable No. 591 along with the report on 5—9—93.

22—9—93 :—Defence about the Constable Nos. 631, 920, 56 for not coming to the drill.

23—9—93 :—Defence about the Constable No. 631 for coming to the Parah late by half an hour and about the Constable No. 933 for coming late for the waiting.

29—9—93 :—Defence about the Constable No. 846 absenting himself for 4 days from 8—9—93.

14—10—93 :—Reports on Constable Nos. 56, 631, 550.

1—11—93 :—Defence from Constable No. 550 was sent for his being absent.

3—11—93 :—When the Constable No. 400 was appointed to go to Pattukota along with the Constable No. 705 to take the accused he refused and when the Constable No. 400 was asked a defence for having sent the accused along with other Constables he delayed and did not give any defence. A report was sent about that, and then a defence was also sent.

24—11—93 :—Report was sent to the effect that Constable No. 400 received 4 as. from the accused Sevanthaperumal Thevan, on account of that, Constable Nos. 400 and 900 were quarrelling and beating with each other in the Guard.

30—11—93 :—Defence about the Constable No. 525 who receiving the beet for Road No. II did not meet the changing Constable and as far as he went he did not get any signature from him.

1—12—93 :—Report to the effect that Constable No. 525 had lost the medical certificate he received.

Report that Constable No. 900 had changed his sentry Parah late by an hour 5 minutes and the Constable No. 705 did not at all come for waiting.

7—12—93 :—Report to the effect that Constable No. 900 had changed the Parah late by an hour and 25 minutes.

13—12—93 :—It clearly shows from the Parah book that Constable No. 550 waiting from 9 to 3 while his waiting is from 9 to 12 and the Constable No. is to wait from 12 to 3 and a report about this is in the Parah book itself.

19—12—93 :—Report to the effect that Constable No. 56 was waiting from 9 P. M. to 6 A. M. and no other Constables were there.

20—12—93 :—Report that Constable No. 591 did not come to the Parah and Constable No. 1173 was waiting from 10 to 6 in the evening and has given double Parah.

After I was changed to this division I asked the Parah book in the station completed before 9—8—93. Constable No. 1173 refused to give the book. In that book I have reported about many Constables and even remarked in that book. That book not being on hand I am unable to state what have been reported. I have reported many other things so I am not able to say what have I reported. The sentry book is hidden by Head Constable No. 522 so that the reports in it would be revealed. If your honor were graciously pleased to get me the daily reports of Aranthangi station containing from 30—6—93 to 20—12—93 I can positively say what have I reported.

These reports have been sent to the Inspector along with the sentry report dated, 13—2—94.

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :—

That the Superintendent's Minute reducing me from the 4th Grade Head Constable to the 1st Class Constable from 20—4—94 on the alleged grounds that I on 25—3—94 absented myself without leave from, nor handing over the charge of the Treasury Guard and that I myself admit it and so on, I preferred an appeal on 5—6—94 to the D. I. G. who was pleased to confirm the Order of Reduction, as the Head Constable No. 522 through whom my petition in Tamil was submitted, with a view to ruin me did not only keep back the Records I appended to my petition but had also caused my statements to be misconstrued getting it rendered in English by his own man and assuring me that a true translation is made (the minute and the D. I. G's. Order are attached).

2. That I beg to venture to state with full confidence that the following assertions will liberate me from the charges pointed out in the minute for reducing me. That I did not leave the Treasury Guard without delivering charge to a competent person. Informing Head Constable No. 522 of what had happened on 25—3—94, I took due permission to go to the Inspector. The copy of the parah book and Roster submitted herewith will prove that Head Constable No. 522 took charge from me. During the absence of the Inspector from the Cusbah, Head Constable No. 522 that is next in rank to the Inspector is empowered to permit me to go to the Inspector. Thus it will clearly prove that I had a legal permission to proceed and there was no ground to find fault with me.

3. That it is said in the minute that I admit my absence; neither personally nor in my written defence have I so admitted, nor is it pointed out that I admit it in such and such a way. Whence the minute gathers that I admit it I am in no way able to or divine. That had I left the Station without leave, the Head Constable would reported or the Inspector before whom I presented myself would have taken from explanation for leaving the Station without leave. Neither of them have done any such thing. Crediting my report and accepting it as proper the Inspector on 26—3—94 the Head Constable No. 522 to take me as an assistant to him. Besides as he personally

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coward and that I had been guilty of a grave offence and that there was nothing to pardon me. From the foregoing statements it can be inferred that I am not guilty of any such offence. The Constables snatching from the table a cheque for Rs. 470 took to their heels at about 7 A. M. as I was not relieved at 12 noon as I ought to have been. I had to remain till 7 30 P. M. without meals; i. e. till I was relieved by Head Constable No. 522. Where is my cowardly conduct? Had I left the Station when the Row took place or before being relieved I should have been so charged.

4. That my strictness with the Constables and my report to the Magistrate against their irregularity besides the several previous reports that had brought on them due punishments roused Constables against me of whom Constable No. 846 snatching from the table a cheque for Rs. 470 together with the para book and my private memo book at 7 A. M. took to flight the other Constables conniving at it with a view that I might be entangled into difficulties, but I overtook Constable No. 846 and recovered from him the said cheque and the memo. Had I been a coward as the minute observes I would have left the station then and there and would not have recovered those things. I remained in the station from 7 A. M. when the row commenced till 7-30 P. M. the time when I was relieved by the Head Constable No. 522 though I should have been relieved at 12 noon by Constable No. 547 the writer being a party to the said faction.

5. That had I been really absent on 25-3-94 and left the station without delivering charge or taking permission from the Head Constable how can it be entered in the Inspector's diary, duty Roster, and the Station reports dated 25, 26, 27-3-94 that I had been on duty to the Inspector? or how could I have been allowed on the following days to go on with my duty without taking any explanation from me for the alleged absence? It was only on the Superintendent's direction i. e. on 8-4-94 I was called on to give an explanation why I absented myself on 25-3-94.

6. That on my report to the Inspector the Constable No. 846 was recommended for punishment and Constables No. 56 and 631 for transfer which were, in due course effected, and the Inspector was further pleased to direct me by a written Order on 26-3-94 to do duty as an assistant to the Head Constable and the writer to look after the Treasury. And my duty for 26-3-94 is marked as having been sent to the Inspector on duty.

7. That the Roster and Sentry book whose copies are attached to this suffice to refute the charge that I left the Station without leave or permission or handing over the charge and vindicate my innocence, the other Constables that know all about this are sure to ignore the fact because of their grudge against me. The fact of the Head Constable remaining in the Station the whole night appointing each watch and signing in the Sentry book wherein his taking charge from me is also initialed proves that I left the Station not without permission. The Inspector's attention was several times drawn to this as he participated the Remark made by the Magistrate on 24-3-94. The Magistrate and parties have seen the entries.

8. That of the Constables of Aranthanghi Nos. 846, 56, 631, 920, 591, 1046, 900, 7, 1280 &c. some were punished for concealing the Hand Cuffs and some were taken in the 41 of 93 being accused of the offence punishable under Section 380 I. P. C. bundle of Constable No. 547 and

10. That, either afraid of the dire consequence of the superior's displeasure or with a view to feed fat the grudge lurking in him against me or to get himself reconciled with the Station Constables by whom he was put to trouble and shame, the Head Constable No. 522 has not only contrived to make the Superintendent believe that I left the Station without leave but has also kept back the records I submitted with my appeal to elucidate my innocence; and in consequence a wrong opinion was formed of me and no proper justice was done to me in my appeal.

Two copies of Sub Jail Reports dated 23 and 24-3-94.

My Separate Report dated 25-3-94.

Copy of the Magistrate's Remark dated 24-3-94.

Two orders of the Inspector 26-3-94 and 5-4-94.

My petition for the copy of the minute dated 5-5-94.

Copy of the Sentry book and Duty Roster of March 94.

11. That as the Constables were refractory irregular and tried to take the cheque for Rs. 470, I thought it advisable to report the matter to the Inspector and restore order and discipline. And so with permission I went to my Division Inspector who was then very close to the Station.

12. That I was enlisted in the Police as a 3rd Class Constable on 5-8-78 and was successively promoted to the 4th Grade Head Constable on 1-4-91 and have discharged my duties in Cuddalore, Tanjore, Salem and again in Tanjore without any defaulter in the Space of 16 years save that dated 20-4-94 that reduces me from the 4th Grade to the 1st Class.

13. That should it only please Your Honor to weigh these my humble statements in Your Honor's sound Judgment they will not fail to convince Your Honor that my conduct is not such as will displease the Superiors, but owing to misrepresentation I have had no Justice: and setting at nought my defaulterless service of 16 years a stroke of pen reduces me from the hard earned 4th Grade to the First Class Constable. Should these convincing proofs be found insufficient and should I be called on to prove these things in person I await Your Honor's kind directions to approach Your Honor's gracious presence with all the necessary records (the copy of the appeal petition in Tamil to D. J. G. prepared by me is also herewith enclosed.) The above mentioned copies together with the copy mentioned the last para altogether 12 copies are enclosed here-in.

And that in conclusion I crave Your Honor's clemency to be gracious to order that I be restored to my former 4th Grade in virtue of my long and service of 16 years.

COPY OF THE TREASURY REPORT.

When I was in the Treasury charge and teaching drill in the evening to the Constables No. 591. 920. 900. 631. 1280. Constables No. 846. came to the spot where drill was taught and stood there bare dress. I told him not to come there bare dress. He said 'Are you a commander-in-chief, do you teach drill to a large company or do teach them drill by companies together like drill is taught in the Head Quarter Office'. Thus he spoke rashly. I told him 'when I say you should not come here bare dress why do you speak vain words'. He stood there tell the drill was taught and when I went to the guard after the drill was over he also came to the guard and stood there boldly and enterprisingly. Then he severely gave a blow in the pillar there and went out Snoring. I have reported about this.

cheque &c Constable No. 56 ran and trampled it with his leg. When, the Sub-Jail

ppan who was in the Cutcherry next came, and saw what was the cry about. Then the
papers were scatered about. From that time till evening all the Constables were in union

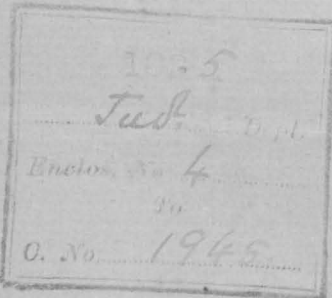

I have the honor to submit for the consideration of His Excellency the Governor in Council, an appeal petition from one Ramachandra Rao, late 4th Grade Head Constable, Arantagi Station, Pudukottai Taluk, Tanjore. I also submit the records connected with the case.

2. The petitioner was reduced on the 20th April 1894 to be a 1st Class Constable by Mr. Thomas the Superintendent, Tanjore, for having on the 25th March 1894 left the Sub Treasury and Sub jail Guard without permission and gone off 8 miles to Complain to the Inspector of the Division of the Condu

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not married Constable 846.

5. The appellant rests his appeal now on the allegation that before running away from the Station he took leave from the Head Constable 522 who was in charge of the Station. He further says that to conceal the facts that he had been granted leave the Head Constable 522 destroyed the Guard book which would show that 522 took over charge from the appellant of the guard when he left the Station. This defence is really an absurd one, for the man was degraded quite as much because he had shown himself incapable of managing his men as for having left his Station without leave. And apart from that had he taken leave, it is almost impossible to suppose he would not have told the Inspector so in the first place and certainly the Inspector would have mentioned it in his report. There is not a word in any of the records to show that the appellant took leave in the manner alleged by him. The Inspector's report written just

of the appeal
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after the occurrence can be well trusted to give a fairly accurate account of what the appellant told him had occurred, and on that statement I consider it was amply shown that the man was quite unfit to be a Head Constable in charge of any body. He clearly ran away from his Station merely because he feared he might possibly be treated. It will be noticed from the Inspector's report that the appellant had fallen out with his men for some time and there was considerable reason to believe that his own malpractices had much to do with the quarrel. 7. It is perfectly clear from the records that the Station was in a complete state of demoralization due to a great extent to the appellant's own conduct. For this he was I think quite properly reduced. I think Mr. Thomas might well have done more than he did. He should have punished the other Constables in the Station with some severity for their conduct. Constable 846 especially escaped with a warning when he should have been punished. But I do not think

it is necessary to re-open the matter, as regards the appellant I have no recommendation to make on his behalf.
