March 30th, 1895.

Visited the Jail this morning attended by the Jailor. With a view to protect the glaring of the sun I would suggest that a tiled roof should be placed over the small platforms which are erected in front of the cells of the Close Prison ward. Even at the early hour of my visit the heat was uncomfortably high and later in the day it must be, I think, almost unbearable to the prisoners who are placed in the above cells more especially in this hot weather.

I, therefore, urge the authorities once more to make provision for putting tiled roofs as was suggested above. If my proposals were to be considered too costly, I am of opinion that sheds covered with cocoanut leaves at least may be put up. If necessary, I request that this matter may be placed before Government for a favourable consideration.

Inspected the N.I. Garden. The condition of which is not as it ought to be, of course, for want of sufficient supply of water. I have noticed a small spring quite close to the big well which I think must be converted into a ring well.

With reference to the provisions of Rule 49 of the Jail Code, I have the honour, at the request of M. R. By Narsingh Rao, a non-official Visitor of the Salem Central Jail, to submit, for the orders of Government the accompanying extract from the remarks recorded by him when visiting the Jail on the 30th March, in which he recommends the provision of a verandah for the Close Prison Blocks of the Salem Central Jail.

2. The Superintendent remarks that "Sheds covered with Cocianut leaves" which the non-official Visitor suggests as an alternative would not be safe, and such erections would doubtless cause some risk



risk of fire and would be unsightly.
 3. The construction of a tiled verandah, with supports made of old iron rails, as lately erected in the Cloister of the Trichinopoly Central Jail, would certainly be an improvement. If the Government is pleased to adopt the recommendation of the non-official Visitor, the Public Works Department should be authorized to prepare an Estimate for the work.
