22nd August last

4. That the said Manjaya Hegde
was the holder of a Darbar Certificate
and during his time he had made
arrangements for the protection of the
temple and its property by keeping
10 guns.

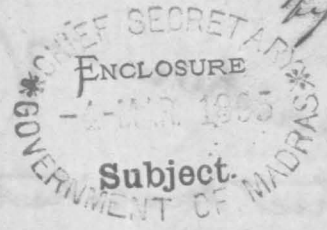

The Sharmapal Hegde, the Mukteswar of Sharmastal Sri Manjunatha Pagoda in the S. Canara Dist. requested exemption for the possession of certain guns for the protection of the temple property. He ^{in Jan'y. last} While submitting the pet. states that he cannot recommend pet. for exemption "as he is merely the son of a man who held a debar certificate & a rich trustee of temple property". It has been ascertained that the guns he wants to possess are not the obsolete arms exempted by G.O. 1076 of the 1884 Act, but are of the following description:-

- Single barreled guns. 4.
- Double - - - 3.
- Single barreled pistols. 2
- Double - - - pistol. 1.

They are not of an obsolete pattern & the applicant wants them in order to protect the temple. Temple records occur in South Canara, as a recent case has shown; & these weapons

appear to have been owned by the
 applicant's ancestors. - It is not that
 the Dist. Judge might well give a
 license for some of the prices at least.
