SIR,

I have the honor to submit
for the orders of Government under
Section 466 of the Code of Criminal
Procedure the records and transla-
tions of the evidence in cases
199 of 94 on the file of the 2nd class
Magistrate Denkinikotta.

2. The accused is a native of
Bangalore and a barber by caste.
He came to see his relations at
Bannathathur village, where

he attempted to commit suicide by inflicting a wound on his throat with a razor. The Police sent a referred charge sheet in the case stating that the accused is of unsound mind. The Sub Magistrate ordered the Police to strike off the case from their file.

3. On receipt of a copy of proceeding in the usual course, I observed that the case should not have been disposed of in this way and ordered that the accused must be put before the Magistrate who should proceed under chapter XXXIV of the Criminal Procedure Code.

4. The Police then charged the
accused

accused under section 309 IPC with having attempted to commit suicide and produced him before the Magistrate. The Sub Magistrate having noticed symptoms of insanity in the accused placed him under the observation of the Hospital Assistant at his Head Quarters. He was of opinion that the accused is of nervous temperament, is eccentric in his actions, is often found gazing into vacancy, soliloquizes, prates incoherently, and attempts to commit violence occasionally to his person but is not otherwise dangerous.

5. The Sub Magistrate has reported that his relations do not come forward as sureties for the accused for his release on bail but there is nothing on record to show that any

any of his relations has been examined
on the point as to whether he is willing
to take charge of him after giving
security. I have therefore directed
him to report on this point after
examining some of the lunatic's
relations who seem to live at
Bangalore.

6. A certificate in Form A and
a medical history sheet as
prescribed ^{under} G.O. dated 29-3-74
No 786 accompanying the record.

7. The delay in submitting these
papers is due to the irregular
procedure adopted by the Sub
Magistrate in the first instance
and to the non appearance of
some of the prosecution witnesses
who are natives of Mysore
and whose presence was
secured

Secured only after the issue of
many warrants.

ORDER—dated 3 May 1895, No. 907.

treatment; the usual periodical reports being
made of the state of his mind.

Jail at Salem will forward criminal
lunatic Rangappa at once
to his destination and intimate the despatch
to the Superintendent of the Asylum by letter
accompanied by all necessary papers.
