humble Petitioner then
appealed to His Excel-
lency the Governor in
Council Madras and that
His Excellency in Council
declined to interfere with
the sentence of death passed
on your humble petitioner

That your humble
Petitioner begs to state that
no one has deposed to say
that he had committed the
offence

That the prosecu-
tion witnesses are - viz: -
one the uncle, second the
grandmother of the deceased
and the third the brother of
the first witness

That from these
three witnesses nothing could
be expected to say regarding
the true facts of the case
but in favor of the prose-
-cution

That these wit-
-nesses and the members
of the deceased form one
Thuvud and the evidence
adduced

adduced by them could
not for a moment be be-
-lieved but on the other
hand your Petitioner's
witnesses had deposed to
the contrary and their state-
-ments are more to be
relied upon for they (de-
-fence witnesses) are the
respectable men of the
place.

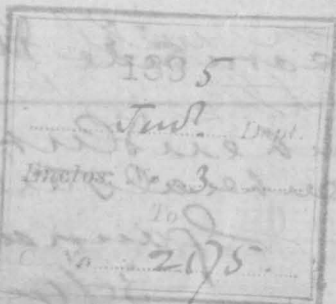
