I have the honor to report that consequent on the death of my wife circumstances at present exist that render it advisable that I should proceed to England at once and it has been suggested that I should avail myself of the High Court vacation for this purpose and that I should leave Madras, if possible, on Thursday evening next, the 2nd May, to catch the mail steamer at Bombay on the 4th May.

It is thought at present that an absence of three months will be sufficient so that I should be able to return in time for the next.
