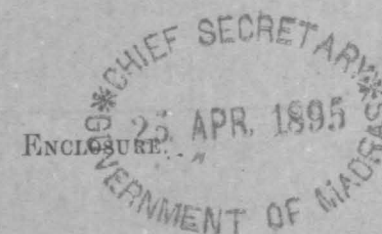

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May it please your Excellency.

I beg to bring The few following lines to your
Excellency's kind Consideration & favour despatch.

I beg to state that I was a Constable in the Laramie police and discharge my duties nobly & satisfactorily to my superiors; but in 1890 I fell seriously ill and being far from any civilized neighbourhood where I could treatment from either good a native physician or any hospital or dispense any petitioned through the Inspector on duty to transfer me to my native place which was not far away from the station of the same staff was in existence & also had a hospital also the matter was misrepresented to the Superintendent and instead of complying with any of those a transfer to my native place at least for a month or leave of any kind for a month or 15 days or lastly a discharge from the Department from the time being. The last and the most miserable in my case was granted sooner than I could have expected and which I was forced to accept by the Inspector on duty with threats and doses. After the expiration of a few months I again made my appearance before the Superintendent and petitioned him fully convinced him all the circumstances that surrounded me.
