Read—the following letter from J. P. HEWETT, Esq., C.I.E., Officiating Secretary to the Government of India, Home Department (Education), to the Chief Secretary to the Government of Madras, dated Calcutta, the 27th March 1895, No. 6-Edl.—173:—

In continuation of Home Department letter, No. 1-Education—375, dated the 14th December 1892, I am directed to state, for the information of the Madras Government, that the Government of India have accepted a proposal made by the Syndicate of the Calcutta University that Judicial officers (as well as Magistrates) should be empowered to countersign the voting papers of those electors who may not be able to attend in Calcutta at the annual election of Fellows of the University.

2. The term "Judicial officers" includes Judges, Subordinate Judges and Munsifs, but not Village Munsifs.

3. I am to request that, with the permission of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the necessary instructions may be issued for carrying out this decision.
