The humble memorial of Chembolu Somasudham
prisoner No 5679 of the District Jail, at Beahampore
under Sentence of death most humbly & respectfully
shoneth:-

1. That your petitioner is only a boy of less than 20 years of age and thereby is in a position of senselessness as to judge right from wrong, he being uneducated.
 2. That your petitioner has committed the offence through his ignorance of law and being unaware as to what will be the consequence of the offence he is committing, owing to his tender age and no education which is the chief cause for scanty sense of distinguishing between right & wrong; that he is sentenced to death by the Court of justice and the sentence was confirmed by the Government of Madras.
 3. That your petitioner is only of a very low age at present and has, sent for the sentence of death, to live a long life more which was destined to him by the God almighty; that if your petitioner be hanged now, the punishment for his offence will have been done to him in his insensible state of wisdom and in a way which he does not know whether he feels it or not; that your petitioner therefore most humbly and respectfully begs & prays your Excellency to pardon him for this offence and to enable him to get education and to lead a wise & virtuous life and die a natural death.
- For this act of Pardon your petitioner as his duty boundener prays.

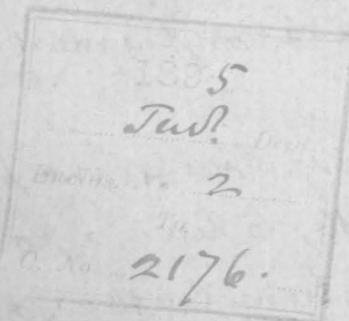
