I have the honor to say that in November 1892, the Superintendent of Police, Kurnool, proposed the reconstruction of the Police office, the existing one - a very old military building - being uninhabitable. Colonel Porters upheld the proposal, but seeing the number of other works - viz -

Police Office, Anantapur -

Police Hospital, Kurnool.

Police lines, Tanjore.

Police lines, Rumbaconum.

Residence for the Assistant Superintendent of Police, Arcotipatam, Vidagapatam District, that were awaiting construction and seeing also that there did not appear from the Executive

Executive Engineer's letter that there was a pressing and immediate necessity for re-constructing the Police office at Kurnool. The Superintending Engineer was asked to state his opinion of the present building and whether he considered that any temporary repairs might be made at a moderate cost so as to keep the building useful for a few years longer. The Superintending Engineer replied that the best course was to restore the roof and sent in an estimate for Rs. 1,150 for the same which was sent to the Superintendent for his countersignature and return. In returning the estimate, the Superintendent remarked on the estimate as follows:-

"I consider this will be money wasted.
"The whole building is rotten from the foundation, the whole should be demolished and a new building erected on the old site."

The estimate with the Superintendent's remarks was referred to the Superintending Engineer for his opinion-

The Superintending Engineer now reports that he does not consider the building suitable for a Police office nor does he consider it worth repair. If however funds cannot be obtained for the construction of a new office at an early date, he considers that the estimate for Rs. 1,150 should be sanctioned in order that the existing building may be made fit for use as a Police office - &c.

2. I request that the Government will be good enough under the circumstances to sanction the estimate for Rs. 1,150, as there is no immediate prospect of a new office being built at Kurnool.
