Proceedings of the Stationary Magistrate (2nd class) of Kottayam dated the 16th April 1895.

Read records in Calcutta Case No. 160 of 1895 on this Court file.

Order.
On the night of 19th March last, the accused Chalappan Paddaimar (a miplak) broke into the Pijilil House in Puthanamsan occupied by 5th witness Pijilil Thuri and took over this witness who was asleep in its middle room and the said Thuri awoke and hearing some body running out he chased and overpowered him from his northern yard as the accused got out of the house through the northern door and made him a prisoner and was soon assisted by 2 of his neighbours in retaining him. The next morning the accused was taken by them before the Pann Police and the Police have charged the said Paddaimar before this Court under sections 457 & 459 I.P. on the 23rd of that month with House breaking by night with intent to commit theft.

2. When the case came on for hearing on 25-3-95 I entertained doubt from what I saw of the accused that he was of unsound mind and consequently incapable of making his defence. I therefore proceeded to enquire into the fact of his unsoundness of mind and addressed the Civil Surgeon placing the accused Paddaimar under his observation.

I know the prisoner Chaliyadan Pakkharumar. He was under my observation for 5 days from the 27th to 31st March last both days inclusive. I consider him to be insane and incapable of making his defence. ^{My} grounds in forming such an opinion of the man are that he has a peculiar frightened look, he is restless moving about from place to place, he is moody, silent, dull, depressed, and has a melancholic appearance. He is slow in grasping facts and is forgetful. He is extremely dirty in his habits, daubing himself with feces and rendering the cell filthy. His natural affections are perverted and it has been reported to me that he is noisy restless and sleepless at nights and that he drinks his own ^{urine}. He says he has 8 children and does not know whether he has a wife or not. He is a proper person to be detained in an Asylum.

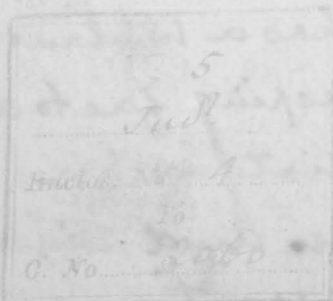

Sir

Under Section 466 C.P.C., I have
the honor to report the following case for
the orders of Government.

2 One Chalayadan Pakkummar, a moplak
aged about 50 years, of Thripunavottu Andam
and Desam Kottayam, is charged by the
Police, before the Stationary Magistrate
of Kottayam, with having committed
house breaking by night with intent to
commit theft after previous convictions, -
punishable under sections 457 and 75 P.C.

3 On the 19th March last the
accused broke into the house of one Pojilil
Thuri of Puthu Andam, Kottayam Taluk
and entered the room in which Thuri was



sleeping by removing the bolt of the door and while groping his way accidentally trod on him. Thuri raised an alarm on which the accused attempted to escape, but he was arrested by P. Thuri, assisted by 2 of his neighbours, and was taken to the Police Station, next morning.

4 The Police produced the accused before the Stationary Magistrate Kottayam on the 21st March who remanded him to the Sub jail Tellicherry pending enquiry. As he manifested symptoms of insanity, he was placed under medical observation and the medical officer certifies the accused to be a lunatic suffering from Chronic mania. The sub magistrate on examining the medical officer and three other witnesses, records a finding that the accused is of unsound mind, incapable of understanding the proceedings before the Court and of making his defence.

5 The offence with which he is charged is not a bailable one. The orders of Government are solicited regarding the place of his custody under

para 2 of section 466 C.P.C. He is now confined in the Sub jail at Tellicherry.
