Pointing out a mistake in the notification extending section 6 clause (a) of the Legal Practitioners' Act, 1879 and submitting an amended notification.

Proposed amended notification

In exercise of the power conferred by section 1 of the Legal Practitioners' Act, 1879, the Governor in Council is hereby pleased to direct that from and after the 1st January 1882, the provisions of the said enactment, so far as they relate to the Judicial Courts Civil and Criminal, established or to be established in this Presidency, shall come into operation in all the territories (except the Scheduled Districts) administered by the Government of Fort Saint George; but nothing in the said act, in any manner affecting Revenue officers or the rights of Pleaders or Revenue Agents or others to practise therein, shall be deemed to be hereby extended to the said territories; and further the said Enactment shall be read subject to the omission of the following words and clauses:—

The clause runs thus:—
"the qualifications, admission and certificates of proper persons to be Pleaders of the Subordinate Courts,
situate within the local limits of its appellate jurisdiction, and, in the case of a High Court not established by Royal Charter, of such Courts."

The clause will run thus:—
"the qualifications, admission and certificates of proper persons to be Pleaders of the Subordinate Courts,
and, in the case of a High Court not established by Royal Charter, of such Court."

Honorable Sir,

With reference to the notification
(subjoined to G.O. dated 26th August, 1881,
N^o 1762) extending the Legal Practition-
ers' Act of 1879 to the ordinary Judicial
Courts, Civil and Criminal, in this Presi-
dency, I am directed to point out
that a mistake has been made in
extending section 6 clause (a) of the
act. The words "situate within
the local limits of its appellate
jurisdiction" should also have
been omitted along with the words
"and of the Revenue offices," since
they clearly refer to "revenue offices"
and not to "Subordinate Courts."

2. I am to point out that the effect of the notification as framed by Government is to impose a restriction which the Act does not contain and which is to that extent ultra vires.
