Sir

With reference to Government
Order dated 4th December 1894 No.
2953, I have the honour to submit
that my proposals do not involve
any extra expenditure from the
Village Service Fund. There is no
intention to form any new groups.
The groups shown in the list submit-
ted are nattams which have already
been constituted as such at the re-
vision of village establishments. The
apparent groups are only revenue villages

and some of them consist of two or
 three villages grouped at revision. In
 Government order 431 Judicial
 28-2-93, it was
 ordered that when the local jurisdiction
 of the village Court is continuous
 with a village, the Collector shall ap-
 point to be village munsiff, the person
 discharging the duties of the office of
 head of the village. For example, in
 the Revenue village of Valavanoot
 in the Villaputur Taluk, the monegar
 is also the munsiff of the nattam, which
 consists of 2 villages. I, therefore, respec-
 fully submit that my proposals do not
 necessitate the issue of any notifica-
 tions under section 6(1) of the Act.
