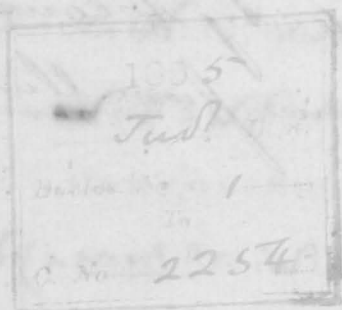

I searched for the boy when my
employers told me to do so. The boy was not
found. As there are two factions in the village
this case is brought unjustly against me. The
Police tortured my concubine to give evidence
in the Lower Court that I committed murder.
She said in the Sessions Court that I did not
commit murder. As this case was charged
against me owing to the enmity of the village
Muniff and the factions in the village, I
humbly pray Your Majesty to consider
my case and to pardon me from this
sentence of death.
