The Ch of Commissioner, Burma, asks if the Govt will consent to the transfer to Madras Asylums of 19 civil lunatics confined in the Rangoon Asylum who are believed to be natives of the Presidency.

On a previous occasion P.O. 278. 10-92 No 1898 the Govt raised no objection to the transfer of these lunatics from Rangoon to Madras; the only question then considered was whether there was accommodation available. - There is not ample room in the Madras Asylum alone for 19 extra lunatics, but it is submitted that, as most, if not all, of them are non-paying patients, the Govt is in no way called upon to undertake the charge of looking after them.

The office is unable to trace any case in which lunatics in Madras Asylums have been transferred to Asylums in other Presidencies. P.O. 2712. 7. 90 No 1150-1 refused to accept a proposal to transfer 44 ^{civil} ~~non~~ ^{civil} lunatics from Rangoon but the reason stated was want of

accommodation. The Govt. however in
No. of 16-1-91 No 91 however subsequently
agreed to accommodate 16 of the
number.

There is of course plenty of
accommodation now, but con-
sidering the expense which the
upkeep of the asylum costs causes
to the Govt it is submitted that
Barma should be informed that
we are not prepared to accept
more paying civil lunatics.
