Stating for the information of Government that intimation was received here on the 17th Ultimo from the authorities at Goa that Abdul Rasul had left Goa by Steamer for Mangalore.

May this be Recorded?
It seems expedient to ask the Govt of Bombay to ascertain why the man was permitted to leave Goa & then to refer the case to the Govt of India which may think it advisable to take steps to come to some arrangement with the Portuguese authorities on the subject of extradition. At present extradition between B. India & Goa seems to be effected by a mere act of State & if the Portuguese authorities plead that they had no power to detain Abdul Rasul in the absence of any treaty, the G. of I. may consider it necessary to move in the matter.

A telegram can also go to the Resident in Travancore telling him that he need not send the warrant called for in G.O. of 18/12/94, No. 3132A.

Keywell - ask the Mayor as proposed.
As regards extradition with Goa, until quite recently I believe there was no extradition treaty between B. India (which covers India) & Portugal (which covers Goa). But I have a recollection that this door was opened towards criminals two or three years ago. I think the point came up in the case of the man who was arrested at Goa.

With reference to G.O., No. 3012, dated 10th December 1894, I have the honor to state for the information of Government that intimation was received here on the 17th Ultimo from the authorities at Goa that Abdul Rasub had left Goa by steamer for Mangalore.

II. Telegrams were at once despatched to the Canara Police at Kundapur and Mangalore directing the arrest of this man; he was not found on board and up to the present time the police have failed to trace him.

III. Beyond the fact of wiring his departure, the Goa authorities have offered no explanation of the circumstances under which he was permitted to leave; on the 29th November, they reported that he

being detained under surveillance. —
Apparently, however, the Goa authorities
considered that they had no power to detain
the man, there being no extradition treaty
in force in Goa.

IV. Gulam Rasul was the ringleader
in the Cape Comorin temple burglary
and it is matter for regret that he should
thus have been allowed to escape.

I am directed to forward

the Sg. of Police, Madras,
wherein that officer reports
that the man in question
has been apprehended, appar-
