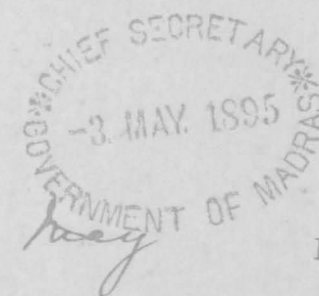

Resolutions passed at a public meeting
held at Madurantakam on Mr 24.

M Rky. M P Rungachariar Mirasidar and
Hon Secretary Agricultural Association
Madurantakam presided.

Resolved:—

That owing to the interference of
the Tahsildar Mr Arumugam Pillay
and the Submagistrate Mr Loganathan
Dyer into the private affairs of the
people (Brahmins in particular) there
exists a bitter ill feeling between
the said officers and the people.

2. That in the opinion of the public
the conviction of the 2 Brahmin
boys who were whipped as having
taken part in a petty theft (C.C. No. 7
on the file of the submagistrate of
Madurantakam) is not founded
on truth and the attention of the
Government be drawn to two
articles published in "Swadesamitran"
dated 5th April 1895 which with
some exception applies to this
case.

That His Excellency Lord Dalhousie
Government be addressed on the
matter praying that some responsible
officer may be deputed with instructions
to hold an investigation into the
details of the ill feeling and the
origin of the said criminal case
