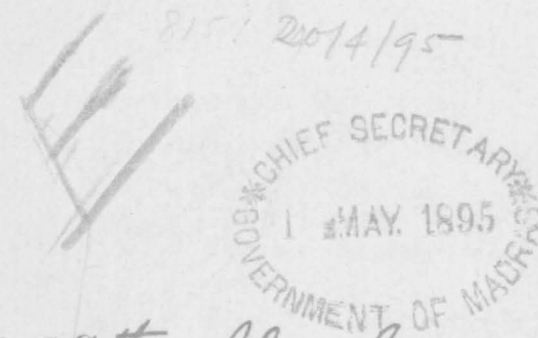

Sir,

The period of six months during
which I have been appointed to hold
my Court at this station fast approaching
to expire and seeing that some original
suits, which are now under trial, and
some old Appeals may fully occupy
my time till the end of the month,
leaving me no time to write judgments
in cases which may be closed here-
after, I have the honor to request
that you will be so good as to obtain
sanction

Every letter, whether printed or in manuscript, should be do-

Enclosures and statements also, whether sent with letters, or
merely under cover, should be numbered, docketed and abstracted.
The headings of statements should be written in full to prevent
mistakes, (G. O., 8th April 1893, No. 239, Public.)

sanction of the High Court, and if necessary of Government also for my continuing doing duty here for another week, so that the work I may be obliged to do during that week may be legal and valid.

2. 3 Original suits are now with Arbitrators, and I expect their awards in a day or two. It requires 10 days after the receipt of the records and service of notices on the parties for receiving objections and passing final decrees.

3. An original suit is now under trial and another which is almost closed will be finally heard tomorrow or the next day. Being a case relating to property of large magnitude, a High Court advocate and a vakil are engaged in it. They may probably

prolong their address till Monday, some few heavy Appeals are also to be argued by them. Thus if I am fully occupied up to the 30th Instant, I will have no time to write my judgments before the evening of the 30th.

4. By asking for permission to do work here for another week after the 30th, I do not mean to ask for an extension of the recess allowed for my Court, and I am prepared to open my Court at Coimbatore on the 1st of July next.

5. My time for holding Court at this station being limited for six months only and by my not being a permanent Sub-Judge attached to this District, the members of the bar are objecting to my doing any judicial business

business after the 30th Instant without a formal sanction of Government to legalize my work.

6. This Court was originally intended to be held here to work for six months, but we arrived and opened the Court on the 10th of November last, as I had to do work at Salem up to the very afternoon of the 31st October and was obliged to remain there and complete judgments, as directed by the District Judge, during the joining time allowed to us.

7. Thus, the period of six months during which my Court is directed to be held here, will not be completed before the 10th May. It is very unsatisfactory to myself to return cases almost heard without completing judgments.

As the work which may remain to be

done in May will not be much, and as I shall be mostly engaged simply in writing judgments in cases closed hereafter, I believe the High Court will not object to the proposal I now submit, as it causes no inconvenience to anyone else, except myself, while I am hurrying to leave this place as early as possible owing to several domestic inconveniences.

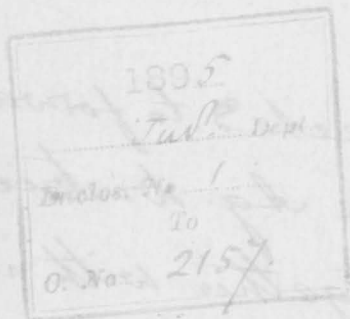
