rigorous imprisonment for 6 months and to pay a fine of  
Rs.50 with rigorous imprisonment for 6 weeks in default  
for an offence under section 4 of Ordinance No.V of 1932,  
rigorous imprisonment for 6 months and to pay a fine of  
Rs.50 with rigorous imprisonment for 6 weeks in default  
for an offence under section 17 (1) of the Criminal Law  
Amendment Act and to rigorous imprisonment for 18 months  
and to pay a fine of Rs.100 with rigorous imprisonment  
for 3 months in default for the offence under section  
17(2) of the Amendment Act - the substantive sentences  
of imprisonment to run concurrently. Of the total fine  
of Rs.200 imposed on her, only Rs.9-10-0 was recovered by

REMARKS OF THE SUB-DIVISIONAL MAGISTRATE

In the Court of the Sub Divisional Magistrate, Tuticorin

This case coming on for disposal this the twenty-ninth day of March 1932, the Court delivers the following:-

J U D G M E N T.

The accused Subbammal is the fifth Dictator of the Tuticorin Taluk Congress committee which in a Gazette Extraordinary of January 3rd was declared an unlawful association. She has apparently been arrested for persistent picketing after warning. I have framed charge against her under Section 17 (2) of the Criminal Law Amendment Act.

That she is the Dictator of the unlawful association is proved by the evidence of Pw1 and by the fact that she has signed these notices Exhibit A series as Dictator. It is also admitted by her. She has assisted in the management of the unlawful association signing and distributing notices, which are incidentally of a most objectionable type.

I find her guilty of an offence punishable under Section 17(2) of the Criminal Law Amendment Act and sentence her to undergo rigorous imprisonment for fifteen months and to pay a fine of Rs.100/- or in default to undergo rigorous imprisonment for a further 3 months. The accused is placed in 'C' class.

March 1932, the court delivers the following:-

### JUDGMENT.

The first accused (Akshai) is the dictator of the Tuticorin  
Congress committee which has been declared an unlawful association.

Both accused were arrested this morning while picketing foreign  
cloth shops at Tuticorin. It appears that the police have found it  
necessary to arrest them as it has been previously warned and prevented  
from picketing but persists in her intention. The picketing consti-  
tutes an offence punishable under Ordinance V of 1932 (as amended by  
Ordinance VII of 1932) and since it was in furtherance of the object of  
the Tuticorin Teluk Congress committee is punishable under section  
17(1) of the Criminal Law amendment act of 1908.

The facts are admitted by accused and pleaded guilty to the  
charge. I find them both guilty of offence punishable under section VI  
Ordinance V of 1932 and sentence them to undergo S.I. for 6 months and  
to pay a fine of Rs. 50/- or in default to undergo S.I. for six weeks.  
I find them both guilty of offences punishable under section 17(1)  
of the Criminal Law amendment act of 1908 and sentence them to undergo  
S.I. for six months and to pay a fine of Rs. 50/- or in default to under-  
go rigorous imprisonment for 6 weeks, the substantive sentences of  
imprisonment to run concurrently.

Further I find Akshai as dictator of an offence punishable under  
section 17(2) of the Criminal Law amendment act of 1908 and sentence  
her to undergo S.I. for 12 months and to pay a fine of Rs. 100/- or in

ment will run concurrently with those imposed above. The accused are

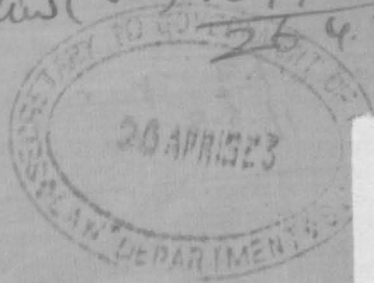
