THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR INDIA.

MY LORD,

We have the honour to transmit for your Lordship's information copies of two Bills which it is proposed to introduce into the Council for making Laws and Regulations at its next meeting on the 4th November.

2. The one Bill proposes to withdraw from the application of the Rent Recovery Act, VIII of 1865 (M.), the districts of Malabar and South-East Wynaad, in which the Act has not, since it became law, been in practical operation. The other Bill is intended to provide a summary procedure by which the Collector may ascertain and determine, with respect to the land paying revenue to Government in those districts, the persons who should be registered as proprietors under Regulation XXVI of 1802; the High Court having ruled that it is only against proprietors so registered that the process made available by Act II of 1864 (M.) for the recovery of the revenue can properly be taken. The Bill is one, therefore, for the security of the land revenue and does not in any way affect civil rights.

3. The grounds on which this legislation has been undertaken are fully set out in the Statements of Objects and Reasons which are annexed to the Bills, and in the Proceedings of this Government and the correspondence with the Government of India, copies of which, as described on the margin, accompany this letter. The necessity of the legislative action proposed arises in connection with the settlement of

Malabar which is now in progress. It has been approved by the Government of India
