No. 46. Read the following letter from Major J. O. HASTED, R.E., Superintending Engineer, Kistna District, to the Secretary to Government, Public Works Department, dated Masulipatam, 22nd February 1877, No. 165 :—

I HAVE the honor, with reference to G.O., No. 446, dated 17th February 1876, to submit a statement showing the account of the old District Engineer's boat which has been sold for Rupees 250. It appears from this statement that almost the exact sum estimated to remain at credit of the boat has been realized, and the original cost of the boat having been 1,100 Rupees, a sum of Rupees 4-4-7 remains to the good.

2. The following statement shows the cost of the new boat, the construction of which was sanctioned in the G.O. above referred to :—

3. The plan for the new boat was kindly furnished by Lieutenant Dorward, R.E., and arrangements were made that it should be built at Narasapur under his supervision, the estimate providing for the completion of the boat with all fittings for Rupees 1,200. Unfortunately shortly after work was commenced Lieutenant Dorward left the Godavery District, and the work could not, I suppose, be properly supervised. In consequence after some delay, I received intimation that the boat had been sent up to Dowlaishweram for certain additions, and that the cost up to date had been Rupees 1,214-10-7. I requested the Officer in charge of Dowlaishweram Workshop to execute only such work as was absolutely necessary and to send the boat to Bezoarah. He did so, and forwarded a bill for Rupees 119-6-5 for work done. On arrival at Bezoarah, I found that the boat was not painted, glass not fitted, windows, &c., without fastenings, and there were no internal fittings. I fitted it up at the Bezoarah Workshop as originally intended, and the cost was Rupees 291.

4. The only way in which the original outlay seems to have a fair chance of being recovered, is to raise the monthly rent from Rupees 24 to Rupees 30 per mensem. It is perhaps rather hard on the District Engineer that he should have to pay additional rent, in consequence of the expenditure having exceeded the estimate as above explained, but the boat is certainly far more convenient and comfortable than the old boat for which a monthly rent of Rupees 24 was charged.
