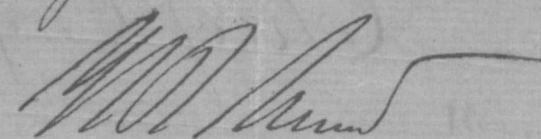
I have the honor to

to be

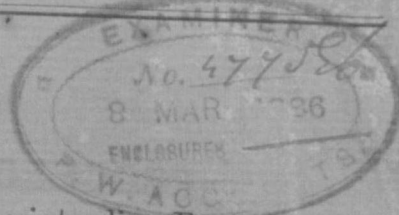
to be supplied with free quarters - As there

Telegram from the Director-General of Post Offices in India, Calcutta, to the Secretary to the Government of Madras, Public Works Department, Madras, dated 26th February 1886.

Your telegram, February 20. India has sanctioned re-appropriation 7,000 for current year's minor works. Please see to its utilisation in current year.

From M. HAMMICK, Esq., C.S., Officiating Postmaster-General, Madras, to the Secretary to Government, Public Works Department, dated Madras, 26th February 1886, No. 15279 :—

I have the honor to draw your attention to the telegram, dated 15th February 1886, from the Director-General of Post Office of India, to the Madras Government, having reference to G.O., No. 267 W., dated 29th January 1886, a copy of which has been forwarded by the Director-General to me.

2. I request that early orders may be issued for the purchase of the building at Russellkonda intended for use as a post office, and also that as much as possible of the Rs. 7,000 now available for expenditure in the current year may be utilised on sanctioned works.

ORDER—dated 2nd March 1886, No. 549 W., Public Works.

The Government of India having sanctioned the transfer, from Major Works to Minor Works, Postal, of the sum of Rs. 7,000 placed at the disposal of the Director-General of Post Offices, in G.O., No. 267 W., dated 29th January 1886, the following appropriations are made therefrom :—

1. Purchase of a building at Russellkonda for post office	641
2. Post office at Bhadrachalam	830
3. Do. at Duggirala	900
4. Do. at Salem	49
Total	2,420

2. The works at Bhadrachalam and Duggirala should be carried out without delay, and steps should at once be taken for the purchase of the building at Russellkonda.

3. The following telegrams will be sent to Superintending Engineers, I and II Circles :—

To Superintending Engineer, I Circle.

"Funds provided for post office, Bhadrachalam, and purchase of building for post office, Russellkonda. Arrange to carry out works."
